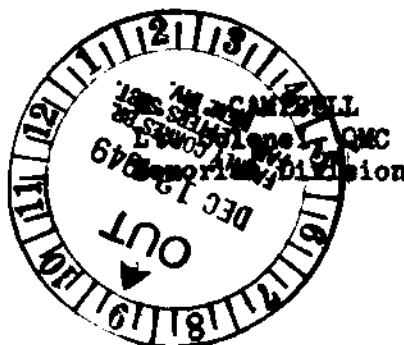
Your letter dated 24 November 1949 concerning the remains of your father, the late Alfred W. Chaskin, has come to my attention.

The United States Military Cemetery St. Laurent, France, will in the near future be relinquished to the control of the American Battle Monuments Commission for beautification and permanent care. However, that office has advised us that they will interpose no objections to your visit to your father's grave.

Dear Mrs. Flurin:

This is to inform you that the remains of your loved one have been permanently interred, as recorded above, side by side with comrades who also gave their lives for their country. Customary military funeral services were conducted over the grave at the time of burial.

After the Department of the Army has completed all final interments, the cemetery will be transferred, as authorized by the Congress, to the care and supervision of the American Battle Monuments Commission. The Commission also will have the responsibility for permanent construction and beautification of the cemetery, including erection of the permanent headstone. The headstone will be inscribed with the name exactly as recorded above, the rank or rating where appropriate, organization, State, and date of death. Any inquiries relative to the type of headstone or the spelling of the name to be inscribed thereon, should be addressed to the American Battle Monuments Commission, Washington 25, D. C. Your letter should include the full name, rank, serial number, grave location, and name of the cemetery.

While interments are in progress, the cemetery will not be open to visitors. You may rest assured that this final interment was conducted with fitting dignity and solemnity and that the grave-site will be carefully and conscientiously maintained in perpetuity by the United States Government.

The official report of burial has been received and discloses that the remains of your father were originally buried in Salzburg, Austria, but were later disinterred by our American Graves Registration Personnel, properly identified, and reinterred in Plot HH, Row 1, Grave 7, in the United States Military Cemetery Neuville-en-Condroz, Belgium, located nine miles southwest of Liege, Belgium.

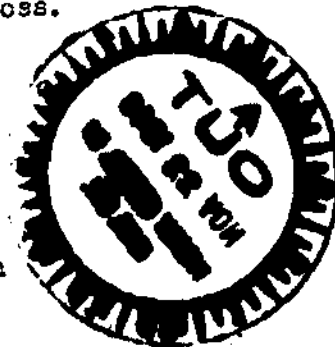

## REMARKS

Unknown X-7329 was disinterred from the Municipal Civilian Cemetery in Salzburg, Austria. Cemetery Records indicated the deceased to be Alfred W. Chaskin, an American civilian internee.

Date and place of death of X-7329 are in agreement with AGO Report of Death on Chaskin.

International Committee of the Red Cross reported that Chaskin was buried in grave number 31, the grave from which X-7329 was disinterred.

Inasmuch as Mr. Chaskin had resided in France continuously since 1912, no dental records are available for this man.

German medical history on Chaskin indicates that a cranial autopsy was performed. Evidence of a cranial autopsy was discovered upon reprocessing of X-7329.

Information received from the State Dept. by telephone reveals color of hair of Chaskin was brown and height 5' 9". This is in agreement with color of hair and estimated height of UNK X-7329.

Records on file in this office show X-7329 to be the only unknown disinterred from Salzburg, Austria.

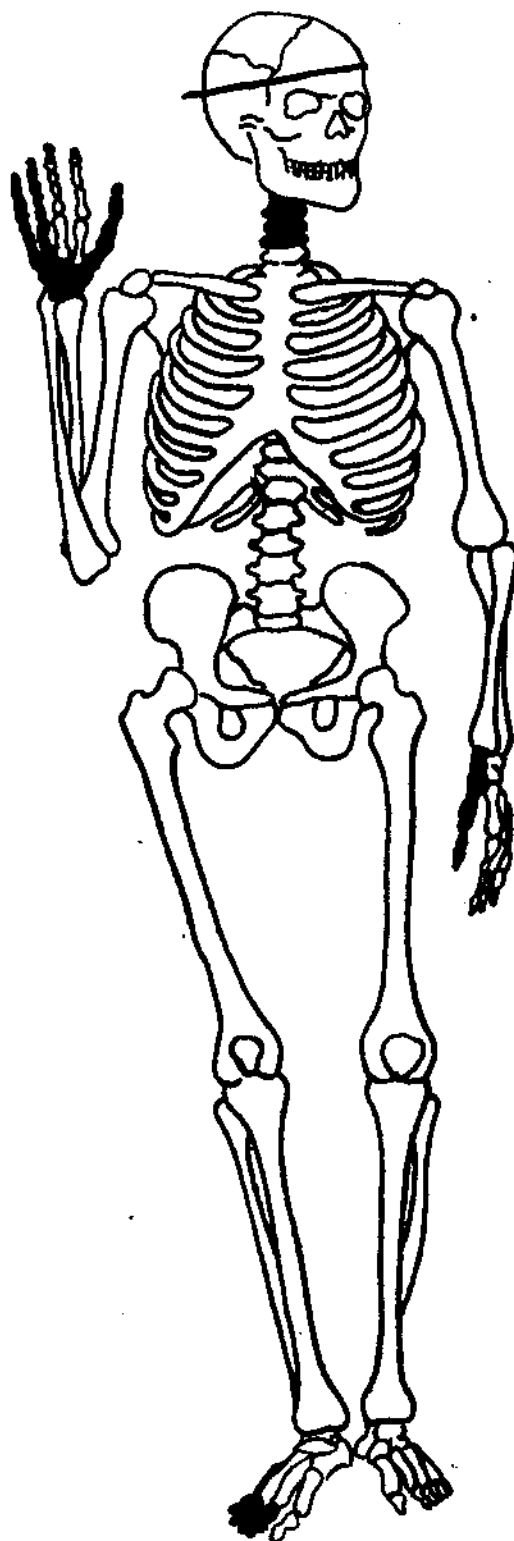

NARRATIVE OF INVESTIGATION

Basic information in this case consisted of letter Headquarters, FFC, AGRC, EA, file number AGRX-293(34), subject: "Burial Information" dated 26 January 1948, and as incl. # 3 OQMG form # 371 on Chaskin, Alfred Warner, AGRC case # 11067.

Acting upon these information the undersigned, together with 2 EM left Vienna, Austria, at 1300 hours 2 February 1948 and proceeded to Salzburg, Austria (N-48/Z-92), arriving there at 2100 hours.

The next morning the office of the Municipal Cemetery of Salzburg was visited, where an extract of the death-register (Incl. # 1) was obtained. It stated that Chaskin, Alfred Warner, who was an Internee of the Internement Camp # 7 at Laufen, Upper Bavaria (N-48/Z-83), and who died at the City Hospital of Salzburg on 3 January 1944, was buried the 7 January 1944 in the municipal cemetery Salzburg, Austria, group 5, row 1, grave 31. According to the same statement he was 57 years old when he died.

The disinterment was made the same morning. The grave had a little metal plate sticking in the ground, with the number 31 on it. The casket was still intact. The body was wrapped in a kind of paper and was only partially decayed.

From the Municipal Hospital the copy of the certificate of admission Incl. # 2 and the copy of the death certificate, with the medical narrative of the development of the illness and the reason of death Incl. # 3 was obtained. It appeared from these statements that Chaskin was treated during 7 weeks in the dispensary of the concentration camp, before being transferred to the Hospital in Salzburg, where he died a week later.

Pre-history :

Patient is hospitalized because of suspected intestinal cancer. Personally he states that he is suffering from stool trouble for approximately 1½ years. He had often noticed a strong colic in the belly and flatus was released with great exertion and pains. He had never noticed any blood or even mucus in the stool. He frequently had felt hard knots in the right lower abdomen above the groin parts. Till 6 weeks ago he was out of bed and walked around but since then he had grown so weak that he had had to remain in bed permanently. Also he had a decided loss of body weight. For 1½ years he also had observed a slight crookedness of his back - he had not noticed it before, only that he knew that he had ever had a straight back. Sometimes he had severe pains in the back which were radiating forward to the heart. The lower part of the rib bow on the left was less sensitive in comparison to the right side. Since recently there was a painful hardening on the left leg, below the hollow of the knee.

Present Status: stout, light-framed patient with reduced nutritional status; very pale, gives a tired and exhausted general appearance.

Cor(heart) : low tones

Pulmo(lung): percutorically AND auscultatorically no pathological findings.

Surgical Status: rectal examination reveals no pathological findings. At the palpation of the abdomen no resistance is felt. There is a distinct gibbus in the reach of the thoracic vertebral column. The vertebral column is sensitive against pressure and knocking in this area.

Course: in the first days patient is complaining about restraint of stool and flatus. Besides there are severe pains over the whole back. Patient is getting weaker day by day and does not take nourishment.

On 30 December patient complains about weakness in the left hand - it is established that the ulnaris nerve is no longer working. Next day a paralysis of the left arm is already established. The condition of the patient is getting worse rapidly and runs out to complete spastic, left side, semiside paralysis. Lumbar puncture gives a liquor with minor dimming. Urine shows no pathological alteration. Encephalography reveals an upward distortion of the right ventricle.

Failing of Circulation: Exitus (death)

Findings by autopsy: swelling metastasis on the left side of the side-lobe-right (rear lobe) and encephalomalical hearth. In the mediastinum a tumour and swelling glands beneath the hilus of lungs; also a swelling in the lung itself which is supposedly the starting-point of the metastasis of brain.

12 January 1944: Histological examination shows a tumour which belongs to the kind of lymphosarcoma. The tumours in the brain were no proper metastases, but tumour embolies which have closed the lumina of the vessels. No tumours or any pathological alterations are established in the vertebral column.

R.S. of findings:

30 December 1943: Xrays of the thoracic-and lumbar vertebral column, anterior and lateral: 11th and 12th thoracic vertebral show a diffuse, spotty decalcification. The upper surface of the 11th vertebra is destroyed by extensive erosion of the edge. The intervertebral space is markedly narrowed. The edges of the vertebra show marked lipping. No abscess formation is present. This appears to be a chronic residual inflammatory process, the specific nature of which cannot be established by roentgenology.

3 January 1944: findings by encephalography: The basal cavities, the ventricle areas are irayed and no definite alterations of position or shape can be recognised. The air layer above the meninges is somewhat extended. The subarrachnoidal areas are also extended.



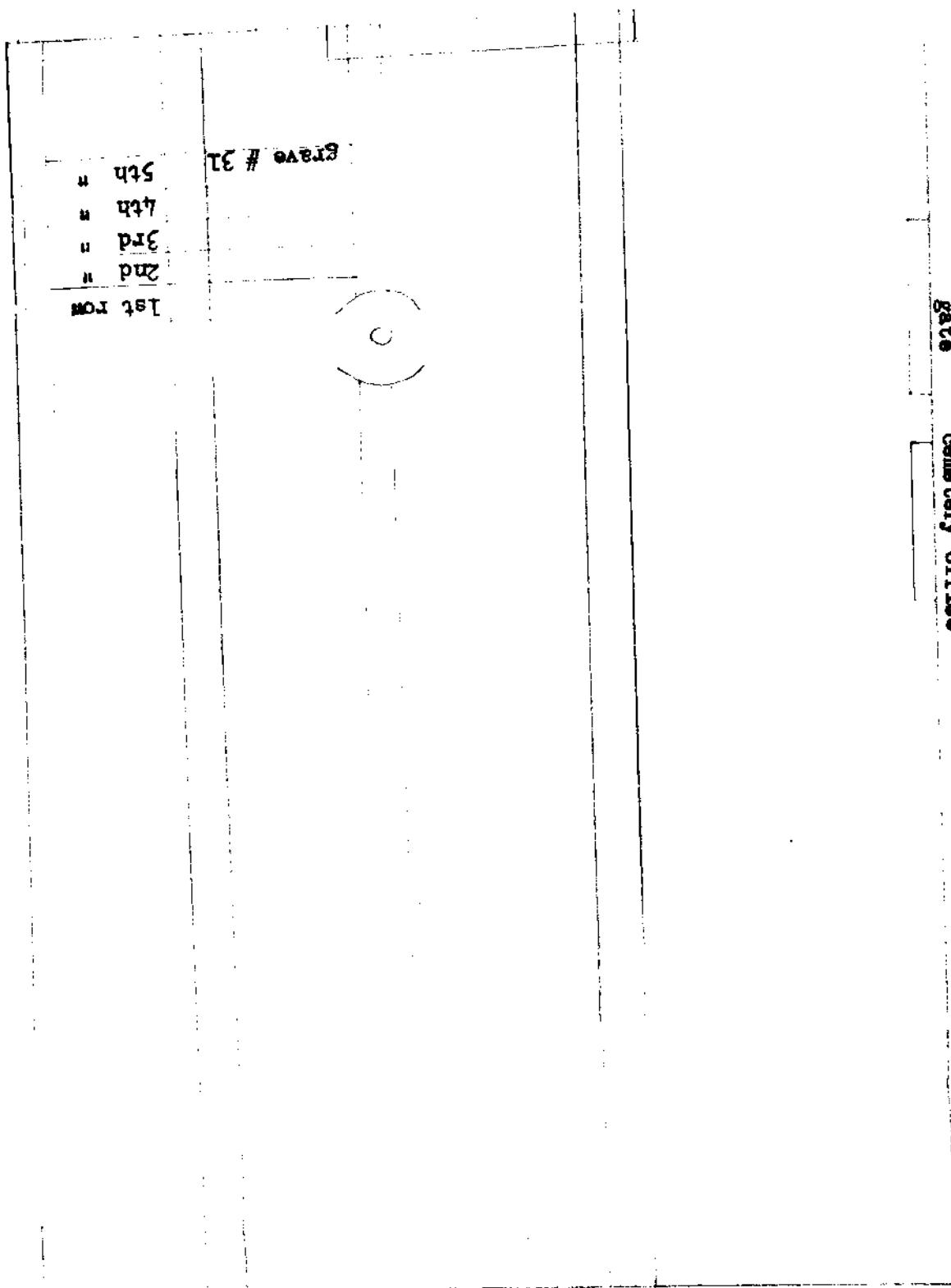

Am 30.12. klagt der Patient über Schwäche in der linken Hand - es kann ein Ausfall des Ulnaris nachgewiesen werden. - Am nächsten Tag besteht bereits eine Lähmung des linken Armes. Das Zustandsbild verschlechtert sich rapid, es kommt zu einer kompletten linksseitigen spastischen Halbseitenlähmung. - Die Lumbalpunktion ergibt nur einen leicht getrübbten Liquor. - Der Harn weist keine pathologische Veränderung auf. Die Encephalographie ergibt eine Verziehung des rechten Ventrikels nach oben.

Kreislaufversagen. Exitus.

Obduktionsbefund: Auf der linken Seite im Seitenlappen eine Geschwulstmetastase - rechts (Hinterlappen) ein encephalomalacischer Herd. Im Mediastinum eine Geschwulst und Geschwulstnester neben dem Lungenhilus; auch in der Lunge selbst eine Geschwulst, die als Ausgangspunkt der Gehirnmetastasen angesehen wird.

12.1.44 Die histologische Untersuchung ergab eine Geschwulst, die in die Reihe der Lymphosarkome gehört. - Die Tumoren im Gehirn waren keine eigentlichen Metastasen, sondern Tumorembolien, die die Gefässlumina verschlossen haben. In der Wirbelsäule konnten keine Tumoren und auch sonst keine pathologischen Veränderungen nachgewiesen werden.

Nachtrag der Befunde:

30.12.43 Röntgenaufnahme der Brust- und Lendenwirbelsäule von vorn und seitlich: 11. und 12. Brustwirbelkörper zeigen eine diffuse fleckige Entkalkung. Die Deckplatte des 11. Wirbelkörpers ist durch ausgedehnte Randusuren zerstört. Die Bandscheibe hochgradig verschmälert. An den Wirbelkanten kräftige spangenförmige Knochenbildungen. Eine Abszessbildung ist nicht nachweisbar. Es handelt sich um einen chronisch rezidivierenden entzündlichen Prozess, wobei die spezifische Natur röntgenologisch nicht sichergestellt werden kann.

3.1.44 Encephalographiebefund: Die basalen Zisternen, die Ventrikelräume und Subarrachnoidalräume sind dargestellt, lassen keine sicheren Lage- oder Formveränderungen erkennen. Der Luftmangel über der Hirnrinde ist etwas verbreitert. Die Subarrachnoidalräume sind also verbreitert.

Pre-history :

Patient is hospitalized because of suspected intestinal cancer. Personally he states that he is suffering from stool trouble for approximately  $1\frac{1}{2}$  years. He had often noticed a strong colic in the belly and flatus was released with great exertion and pains. He had never noticed any blood or even mucus in the stool. He frequently had felt hard knots in the right lower abdomen above the groin parts. Till 6 weeks ago he was out of bed and walked around but since then he had grown so weak that he had had to remain in bed permanently. Also he had a decided loss of body weight. For  $1\frac{1}{2}$  years he also had observed a slight crookedness of his back - he had not noticed it before, only that he knew that he had ever had a straight back. Sometimes he had severe pains in the back which were radiating forward to the heart. The lower part of the rib bow on the left was less sensitive in comparison to the right side, Since recently there was a painful hardening on the left leg, below the hollow of the knee.

Present Status: stout, light-framed patient with reduced nutritional status; very pale, gives a tired and exhausted general appearance.

Cor(heart) : low tones

Pulmo(lung): percutorically AND auscultatorically no pathological findings.

Surgical Status: rectal examination reveals no pathological findings. At the palpation of the abdomen no resistance is felt. There is a distinct gibbus in the reach of the thoracic vertebral column. The vertebral column is sensitive against pressure and knocking in this area.

Course: in the first days patient is complaining about restraint of stool and flatus. Besides there are severe pains over the whole back. Patient is getting weaker day by day and does not take nourishment. On 30 December patient complains about weakness in the left hand - it is established that the ulnaris nerve is no longer working. Next day a paralysis of the left arm is already established. The condition of the patient is getting worse rapidly and runs out to complete spastic, left side, semiside paralysis. Lumbar puncture gives a liquor with minor dimming. Urine shows no pathological alteration. Encephalography reveals an upward distortion of the right ventricle.

Failing of Circulation: Exitus (death)

Findings by autopsy: swelling metastasis on the left side of the side-lobe-right (rear lobe) and encephalomalacic hearth. In the mediastinum a tumour and swelling glands beneath the hilus of lungs; also a swelling in the lung itself which is supposedly the starting-point of the metastasis of brain.

12 January 1944: Hystological examination shows a tumour which belongs to the kind of lymphosarcoma. The tumours in the brain were no proper metastasises, but tumour embolies which have closed the lumina of the vessels. No tumours or any pathological alterations are established in the vertebral column.

P.S. of findings:

30 December 1943: Xrays of the thoracic-and lumbar vertebral column, anterior and lateral: 11th and 12th thoracic vertebral show a diffuse, spotty decalcification. The upper surface of the 11th vertebra is destroyed by extensive erosion of the edge. The intervertebral space is markedly narrowed. The edges of the vertebra show marked lipping. No abscess formation is present. This appears to be a chronic residual inflammatory process, the specific nature of which cannot be established by roentgenology.

3 January 1944: findings by encephalography: The basal cavities, the ventricle areas are Xrayed and no definite alterations of position or shape can be recognized. The air layer above the meningis is somewhat extended. The subarrachnoidal areas are also extended.

number of cells: 350 cells in 1 ccm.



The Department acknowledges the receipt of your letter of December 11, 1946, file No. QMCMR 095, State Department, requesting to be advised of the name of the employer of deceased personnel listed therein.

In reply you are informed that the records of the Department indicate that Passport No. 17 was issued to Carolyn J. Camp on November 18, 1944, in the American Consulate General at Wellington, New Zealand. It appears that the applicant was born at Wellington, New Zealand, on April 30, 1944 and that her father, Buren Burdell Camp, a United States Marine was at that time in the United States Naval Hospital, Treasure Island, San Francisco.

The records indicate further that Passport No. 111 was issued on April 4, 1936 in the American Consulate General at Paris, France to Alfred W. Chaskin who was born at New York, New York on January 29, 1887. Mr. Chaskin stated that he joined the firm of Chaskin and Company, a banking organization, which was liquidated in 1929, and that he had since been working independently in financial transactions and had no definite business ties in France.

The Department can find no record of the issue of passports to the other persons mentioned in your letter.

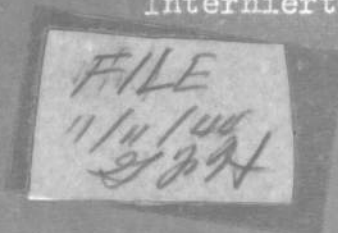

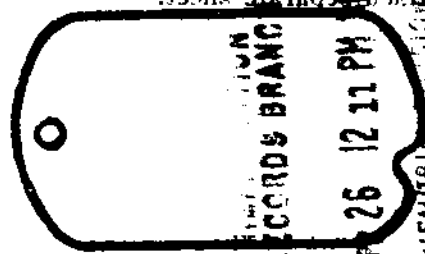

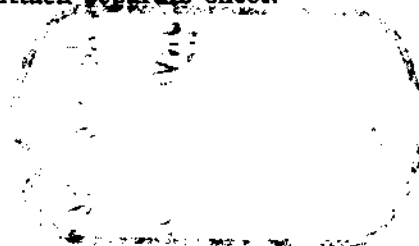
