Dear Sgt. Dickerson:

This is to inform you that the remains of your loved one have been permanently interred, as recorded above, side by side with comrades who also gave their lives for their country. Customary military funeral services were conducted over the grave at the time of burial.

After the Department of the Army has completed all final interments, the cemetery will be transferred, as authorized by the Congress, to the care and supervision of the American Battle Monuments Commission. The Commission also will have the responsibility for permanent construction and beautification of the cemetery, including erection of the permanent headstone. The headstone will be inscribed with the name exactly as recorded above, the rank or rating where appropriate, organization, State, and date of death. Any inquiries relative to the type of headstone or the spelling of the name to be inscribed thereon, should be addressed to the American Battle Monuments Commission, Washington 25, D. C. Your letter should include the full name, rank, serial number, grave location, and name of the cemetery.

While interments are in progress, the cemetery will not be open to visitors. You may rest assured that this final interment was conducted with fitting dignity and solemnity and that the grave-site will be carefully and conscientiously maintained in perpetuity by the United States Government.

Telephoned Mrs. Ethel Goodwin Funderburk, in Daytona Beach, Fla., reaching her through messenger service. She advised that the decedent had a brother, James Fussell Dickerson in the Army in N.C. From AGO, I obtained the information that he is Sgt First Class Jim F. Dickerson, 20402331, Detachment 1, 3420 ASU, Fort Bragg, N.C. I telephoned him and he stated that he believed it best to leave the remains overseas but would like to get in touch with his relatives in Florida and with the remarried widow before making a decision. He said that the aunt who reared him and whom he had regarded as a mother since the death of his own parents is Mrs. E. A. Eason, 4033 9th St., Washington, D.C., telephone Michigan 4755. He asked that I call there and talk with her daughter, Mrs. Doyer, find out their wishes and communicate with him. He would then try to let us have his final decision in the next few days. I telephoned Mrs. Doyer, who stated that she and her mother felt that it would be best to leave the remains overseas.

Your letter concerning your husband, the late Corporal Minor L. Dickerson, has been received in this office.

The War Department has now been authorized to remove, at Government expense, to the final resting place designated by the next of kin, the remains of those American citizens who died while serving overseas with our armed forces during this war.

When the necessary preliminaries have been completed, a letter with an information pamphlet and a "Request for Disposition" form attached will be sent to the next of kin of those American dead. The "Request for Disposition" form, when properly filled out, will constitute the formal expression of the next of kin's detailed desires. Since letters to next of kin will be dispatched automatically and according to the records here, communications with this office regarding this subject will not be necessary.

As you probably know, the supply of steel for the manufacture of caskets is at present uncertain. Without this essential item, the movement of remains cannot properly be initiated. 

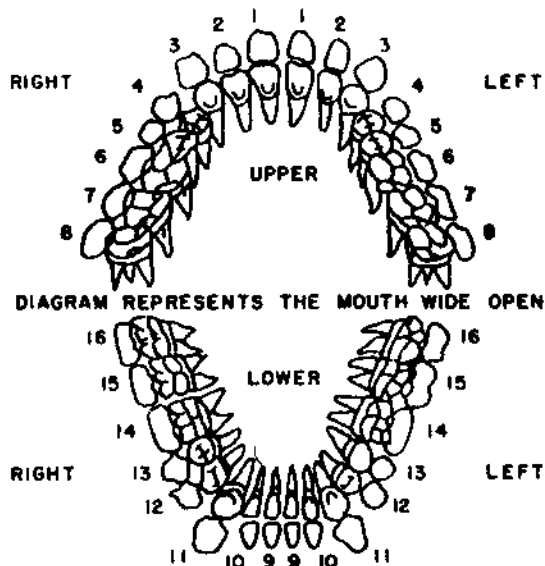


