



Your fiance, Lieutenant (junior grade) George Tyler Howe, Jr., United States Naval Reserve, temporarily based at the Naval Auxiliary Air Station, Otay Mesa, California, has been carried on the official records of the Navy Department in the status of missing since 24 September 1943. The plane which he was piloting on a camera gunnery flight was last seen going into clouds that extended from fifteen hundred feet down to the surface of the ocean. To date, the Navy Department has received no further information concerning the fate of your fiance.

In view of the length of time that has elapsed without any indication that your fiance survived, the Secretary of the Navy has directed that his death be presumed to have occurred on 25 September 1944, which is the day following the expiration of twelve months in the missing status. Your son, Lieutenant (junior grade) George Tyler Howe, Jr., United States Naval Reserve, temporarily based at the Naval Auxiliary Air Station, Otay Mesa, California, has been carried on the official records of the Navy Department in the status of missing since 24 September 1943. The plane which he was piloting on a camera gunnery flight was last seen going into clouds that extended from fifteen hundred feet down to the surface of the ocean. To date, the Navy Department has received no further information concerning the fate of your son.

In view of the length of time that has elapsed without any indication that your son survived, the Secretary of the Navy has directed that his death be presumed to have occurred on 25 September 1944, which is the day following the expiration of twelve months in the missing status. This has been done in accordance with the provisions of Section 5 of Public Law 490, 77th Congress, as amended.

The various agencies of the government having jurisdiction over the settlement of death benefits from deceased naval personnel are being informed. These agencies will forward directly to you the necessary forms to be used in order to file claim for any benefits which may be payable to you.

It is deeply regretted that the hope which you have held during these intervening months for thessafe return of your son must now be concluded. The Navy shares in your loss and extends sincere sympathy to you in your sorrow.

The arrears of pay and allowances due to the deceased at the date of death is payable to a legal representative of the estate of the deceased. In case no legal representative has been appointed for the estate, certain relatives may apply in the following order of precedence: (1) the widow: or if there is no widow, (2) a child or children; or if there is neither widow nor children, (3) the parents equally or the surviving parent; or if there is no widow, child, father, or mother, (4) the brothers and sisters, and children of deceased brothers and sisters.

The person eligible to apply for arrears of pay and allowances should make claim on the enclosed form "Claim for Amounts Due," (Form No. 2047), which should be executed in duplicate in accordance with the instructions printed on it. It is not necessary to claim any specific amount, as this will be determined by the General Accounting Office (Claims Division), Washington, D. C., at the date the claim is settled.

Further details about unpaid accounts of naval personnel are contained in the Act of May 27, 1908, a copy of parts of which is attached for your information.

The death gratuity is an amount equal to six months' pay of the deceased at the rate he was receiving at the date of death. It is payable to the widow; if no widow, to the children; if no widow or surviving children, then to a dependent relative designated by the deceased.

This letter is being addressed to you as the person who appears to be entitled to the gratuity. If you wish to claim the gratuity, you should execute the enclosed "Application for Death Gratuity."





Further details about the six months' death gratuity are contained in the Act of June 4, 1920, as amended, a copy of parts of which is attached for your information.

Both copies of the claim for arrears of pay, if completed, and the application for death gratuity, if completed, should be returned in the enclosed pre-addressed envelope, which requires no postage.

There is also enclosed a "Benefit Guide" which gives information concerning other benefits to which you may be eligible.

# SIX MONTHS' DEATH GRATUITY

Payment of the six months' death gratuity on account of a deceased member of the Naval Service is governed by the Act of Congress of June 4, 1920 (41 Stat. 824) as amended May 22, 1928 (45 Stat. 710) March 7, 1942 (56 Stat. 145, 147), and March 29, 1944 (P. L. 269 - 78th Congress). The law reads in part as follows:

"Immediately upon official notification of the death from wounds or disease, not the result of his or her own misconduct, of any officer, enlisted man, or nurse on the active list of the regular Navy or regular Marine Corps, or on the retired list when on active duty, the Paymaster General of the Navy shall cause to be paid to the widow, and if there be no widow to the child or children, and if there be no widow or child, to any other dependent relative of such officer, enlisted man, or nurse previously designated by him or her, an amount equal to six months! pay at the rate received by such officer, enlisted man, or nurse at the date of his or her death. The Secretary of the Navy shall establish regulations requiring each officer and enlisted man or nurse having no wife or child to designate the proper dependent relative to whom this amount shell be paid in case of his or her death. Said emount shall be paid from funds appropriated for the pay of the Navy and the pay of the Marine Corps, respectively: Provided, that if there be no widow, child, or previously designated dependent relative, the Secretary of the Navy shall cause the amount herein provided to be paid to any grandchild, parent, brother or sister, or grandparent shown to have been dependent upon such officer, enlisted man, or nurse, prior to his or her death, and the determination of such fact by the Socretary of the Navy shall be final and conclusive upon the accounting officers of the Government, and Provided further, that in the event of the death of any beneficiary before payment to anc collection by such beneficiary of the amount authorized herein, such amount shall be paid to the next living beneficiary in the order of succession above stated."

The benefits of this provision were extended to members of the Naval Reserve on active duty by Public Lew 16, 77th Congress (March 17, 1941, amending Public Lew 775, 76th Congress (August 27, 1940) as further amended by Public Law 269, 78th Congress (29 March 1944).

# Arrears of Pay

The settlement of pay due to deceased Havy personnel and unpaid at date of death is governed by the Act of Congress of May 27, 1908 (35 Stat. 373), which reads as follows:

"Hereafter, in the settlement of the accounts of deceased officers of enlisted men of the Navy and Marine Corps where the amount due the decedent's estate is less than one thousand dollars and no demand is presented by a duly appointed legal representative of the estate, the accounting officers may allow the amount found due to the decedent's widow or legal heirs in the following order of procedence: First, to the widow; second, if the decedent left no widow, or widow be dead at time of settlement, then to the children of their issur, per stirpes; third, if no widow or descendants, then to the father and mother in equal parts provided father has not abandoned the support of his family, in which case to the mother alone; fourth, if either the father or mother se dead, then to the one surviving; fifth, if there be no widow, child, father or mother at the date of settlement, then to the prothers and sisters and children of decessed prothers and sisters, per stirpes, there the amount due the decedent's estate is \$1,000 or more and no demand is presented by a duly appointed legal representative of the estate, the accounting officers may allow \$1,000 of the amount due to the estate to the ridge or legal heirs in the order of precedence herein above set forth. Provided, that this act shall not be so construed as to prevent payment from the amount due the decedent's estate of functed expenses, provided a claim therefore is presented by the person or persons the actually poid the some before settlement by the accounting officers."



Dear Mrs. Howe:

This is in reply to your letter of recent date concerning your son, Lieutenant George Tyler Howe, Jr., United States Naval Reserve, who was presumed dead by the Secretary of the Navy on 25 September 1944, having been officially reported to be missing as of 24 September 1943, while serving as pilot of a plane, a unit of Fighting Squadron THIRTY-FIVE, lost during a camera gunnery flight off the coast of California.

According to the records on file in this Bureau the plane was last observed going into the clouds that extended from fifteen hundred feet down to the surface of the ocean. The reports indicate that the pilot may have had his artifical horizon caged during runs and subsequently flown into the sea. A thorough search was made of the area, but no trace was found of your son or the aircraft.

In view of the circumstances surrounding the tragedy which occurred approximately eight years ago, it is deeply regretted that this Bureau cannot encourage a hope for the ultimate survival of your son, and the belief that he could possibly have become a victim of ammesia, or may be held against his will in Mexico. The Mexican authorities would have reported the presence of an American suffering from loss of memory, and his identification could have been easily made by comparison of fingerprints, which are kept on file in a central depositary here in Washington.

It is hoped that you may receive comfort in the thought that your son gave his life for his country, upholding the highest traditions of the Navy.
