

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

Dear Mrs. Privoznik:

This refers to your recent inquiry regarding the personal effects of your son, Private First Class James F. Privoznik.

I am sorry to report that the Army Effects Bureau has not yet received any of his property. It is reasonable to assume, however, that his belongings ultimately will reach here, as all War Department agencies have instructions to forward the personal effects of military personnel to this Bureau for disposition. Transportation delays generally are encountered in delivery of effects, and considerable time should be allowed for the return of property from overseas.

The War Department is most desirous that you be furnished information regarding the burial location of your son, the late Frivate First Class James F. Privosnik, A.S.H. 36 640 529.

The records of this office disclose that his remains are interred in the U. S. Military Comstery Heam, plot L, row 11, grave 265. You may be assured that the identification and interment have been accomplished with fitting dignity and solemnity.

This cometery is located two and one half miles cost of the city of Luxenbourg, and is under the constant care and supervision of United States military personnel.

The War Department has now been authorized to comply, at Government expense, with the feasible wishes of the next of kin regarding final interment, here or abroad, of the remains of your loved one. At a later date, this office will, without any action on your part, provide the next of kin with full information and solicit his detailed desires.

The people of the United States, through the Congress have authorized the disinterment and final burial of the heroic dead of World War II. The Quartermaster General of the Army has been entrusted with this sacred responsibility to the honored dead. The records of the War Department indicate that you may be the nearest relative of the above-named deceased, who gave his life in the service of his country.

The enclosed pamphlets, "Disposition of World War II Armed Forces Dead," and "American Cemeteries," explain the disposition, options and services made available to you by your Government. If you are the next of kin according to the line of kinship as set forth in the enclosed pamphlet, "Disposition of World War II Armed Forces Dead," you are invited to express your wishes as to the disposition of the remains of the deceased by completing Part I of the enclosed form "Request for Disposition of Remains." Should you desire to relinquish your rights to the next in line of kinship, please complete Part III of the enclosed form. If you are not the next of kin, please complete Part III of the enclosed form.

If you should elect Option 2, it is advised that no funeral arrangements or other personal arrangements be made until you are further notified by this office.

Will you please complete the enclosed form, "Request for Disposition of Remains" and mail in the enclosed self-addressed envelope, which requires no postage, within 30 days after its receipt by you? Its prompt return will avoid unnecessary delays.

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

Dear Mrs. Privoznik:

This is to inform you that the remains of your loved one have been permanently interred, as recorded above, side by side with comrades who also wave their lives for their country. Customary military funeral services were conducted over the grave at the time of burial.

After the Powartment of the Army has completed all final interments. the cemetery will be transferred, as authorized by the Congress, to the care and supervision of the American Battle Monuments Commission. The Commission else will have the responsibility for permanent construction and beautification of the cometery, including erection of the remanent headstone. The headstone will be inscribed with the name exactly as recorded above, the rank or rating where appropriate, organization, State, and date of death. Any inquiries relative to the type of headstone or the smelling of the name to be inscribed thereon, should be addressed to the American Battle Monuments Commission, Washington 25, D. C. Your letter should include the full name, rank, serial number, grave location, and name of the cemetery.

While interments are in progress, the comptery will not be open to visitors. You may rest assured that this final interment was conducted with fitting dignity and solognity and that the grave-site will be carefully and conscientiously maintained in perpetuity by the United States Government.
