





In compliance with basic communication 2d Lt VERNON C. BUCHANAN, O-707222, Navigator-Bombardier, was killed in action on 9 January 1945. At first the crew was carried as missing in action but on 26 January 1945 the status was changed from missing in action to killed in action based on testimony of Radio Gunner, Technical Sergeant Walter J. Nelson, 20246140, single survivor of the above officer's crew who was rescued by Filipino Guerrillas and returned to Military Control to verify the following information: The airplane was hit by enemy 20 mm. explosive shell in Pilot's compartment and burst into flames. Pilot hastily crash-landed aircraft at Angeles, Central Luzon, Philippines, at 1115/I. Pilot, Bombardier-Navigator and Armorer Gunner were burned to death in airplane, Co-Pilot and Engineer Gunner were wounded and placed by wrecked airplane by Radio Gunner who left to seek help. Throats of Co-Pilot and Engineer Gunner were slit by Japs and Radio Gunner rescued as stated above. Bodies were not recovered.





1. Remains of Lt Vernon C. Buchanan and other deceased mentioned in basic letter have not been located.
2. Investigation reveals that a plane crashed at rear of the church convent resulting in the burning to death of three crew members and subsequent killing of other two members probably by Japanese. According to the parish priest all five bodies were buried at the scene of the crash, but they were later recovered by a Col Morgan, who was stationed at Camp Dau, approximately one week after arrival of Americans in that area.
3. Further information re - Col Morgan, or disposition of the five bodies is not known, although the parish priest stated that it was possible that the remains of two men were sent to Manila and three to Camp Dau.
4. Search of Manila #1 and #2 Cemetery, files reveals no record of remains of person mentioned in basic communication.



Sir:

This is in reply to a letter from your office of April 12, 1946, reference SPQYG 704.5 in which you ask for information concerning the recovery and burial of the remains of the crew members on B-25 J 43-36187, which crashed in Angeles, Central Luzon, Philippines on January 9, 1945.

The writer, of course, has no record in this instance, but I recall that I did personally supervise the recovery of the bodies of certain crew members of a B-25 on or about February 1, 1945.

I believe that I can best impart this data to you in narrative form and the circumstances were as follows:

On or about February 1, 1945, I received information that several bodies of American airmen were buried near a church in Angeles, Luzon. I immediately contacted the Filipino Priest of this church and found that a B-25 had been disabled in the air over Clark Field (prior to our occupation of that area) and in attempting a landing had crashed through the top of the church. The roof of the church was very badly damaged and some 200 yards farther on there were parts of what Filipinos told me to be a B-25. We could not secure the numbers on the B-25, but on the vertical stabilizer there was an insignia of an Indian head, which I found later to be the insignia of a unit known as the Red Raiders or some such name. In other words, the name was Raiders, but I am not sure as to whether or not it was RED Raiders.

The Priest showed me the grave marker that the Japanese soldiers had set up over the common grave of five air crewmen from this B-25, and I immediately dispatched members of the Grave Registration Unit that was attached to my office, to disinter these bodies.

I personally saw the disinterment and know that the Grave Registration Unit made every attempt to obtain identification which was impossible due to the fact that the bodies were over 50% decomposed, and the local Filipinos told us that the Japanese had taken the identification tags and all other personal effects from the bodies before they were buried. However, we did recover sufficient of the remains to find that there were, or had been five bodies buried.

The remains were buried at Oulaye Cemetery No. 1 located approximately 500 yards west of Dau Station, which is a station on the railroad near the intersection of the main highway from Manila, North, and the road that leaves this highway to Fort Stotsenberg.

The retained copies were turned over to the 43rd Division Quartermaster who relieved the 40th Division (of which I was the Division Quartermaster) on March 1, 1946. I do not recall the unit designation of the Graves Registration Unit, but do know that it was a XIV Corp Graves Registration Unit. All of the bodies were interred as UNIDENTIFIED.
