He will enter upon active duty under this commission only when specifically
ordered to such active duty by competent authority.
And I do strictly charge and require all Officers and Soldiers under his command
when he shall be employed on active duty to be obedient to his orders as an officer of his
grade and position. And he is to obey and follow such orders and directions from time
to time, as he shall receive from me, or the future President of the United States of
America, or the General or other Superior Officers set over him, according to the rules
and discipline of War.

This commission evidences an appointment in the Army of the United States under
the provisions of section 37, National Defense Act, as amended, and is to continue in
force for a period of five years from the date above specified, and during the pleasure
of the President of the United States, for the time being.

Done at the City of Washington, this twenty-fourth day of May
in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty, and of the
Independence of the United States of America the one hundred and sixty-fourth.

This letter is to confirm my recent telegram in which you were regrettably informed that your husband, Captain Paul White, O-391908, Infantry, has been reported missing in action in France since 6 August 1944.

I know that added distress is caused by failure to receive more information or details. Therefore, I wish to assure you that at any time additional information is received it will be transmitted to you without delay, and, if in the meantime no additional information is received, I will again communicate with you at the expiration of three months.

The term "missing in action" is used only to indicate that the whereabouts or status of an individual is not immediately known. It is not intended to convey the impression that the case is closed. I wish to emphasize that every effort is exerted continuously to clear up the status of our personnel. Under war conditions this is a difficult task as you must readily realize. Experience has shown that many persons reported missing in action are subsequently reported as prisoners of war, but as this information is furnished by countries with which we are at war, the War Department is helpless to expedite such reports. However, in order to relieve financial worry, Congress has enacted legislation which continues in force the pay, allowances and allotments to dependents of personnel being carried in a missing status.

Permit me to extend to you my heartfelt sympathy during this period of uncertainty.

Reference is made to your recent letter regarding your husband, Captain Paul White, who has been missing in action in France since 6 August 1944.

I wish to thank you for the information you have furnished and to assure you that it is being utilized in the continuous investigation conducted by the War Department in an effort to locate missing persons and definitely establish their status.

Your desire to obtain further information concerning your husband is fully understood. It is the expressed policy and constant effort of the War Department to furnish to the families concerned, without any solicitation on their part, all information as it becomes available regarding our missing personnel and to this end everything that is humanly possible is being done to ascertain their status and whereabouts. When military personnel are captured by the enemy, the names of the prisoners are furnished to the International Red Cross and in turn are reported to the War Department, but in many cases, it has been noted that several months elapse before such reports are obtained by the International Red Cross. A continuous check is being made of the prisoner of war lists received; however, up to this time your husband's name has not appeared on any of these lists.

I extend my sympathy during this period of anxiety.



1. In regards to your letter of June 5th. concerning Captain Paul White O-391998 whom you have listed as missing in action.

2. On August 6, 1944 near Mayenne, France time about 2130, the Capt. was driving our Jeep, our regular T4 driver was riding in the right front seat and I was riding in the rear seat. Our Regiment had been formed into a task force. The first Bn. was leading it. We had started forward to the first Bn., when we were ambushed at a cross road by a small German patrol. We were fired on with a machine gun and bazooka. The first burst killed the T4 and hit me in 4 places, and at the same time knocked the T4 and I out of the Jeep into the ditch by the side of the road. The Capt. was still in the vehicle and finally stopped at the edge of the road. The German's were firing all the time. When the vehicle stopped the Capt. made no attempt to get out of the vehicle. The German's quit firing and after waiting a while came up to the Jeep and pulled the Capt. out and took him away with them. I'm sure that he must have been wounded, but how bad I don't know. I was told later in a letter from Lt. Martin J. Manhoff of the same Regiment and Company that his helmet was found near the Jeep with blood on it. 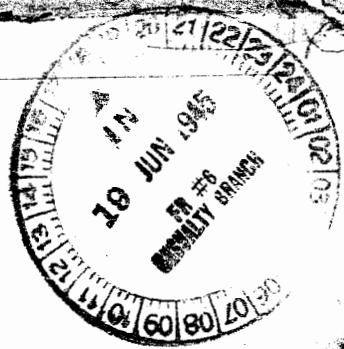

I. - FACTS

1. The following-named officer of Service Company, 357th Infantry, has been carried on War Department records as missing in action, since 6 August 1944 in France, as reported by ETO Shipment No. 164:

2. This officer's AG 201 file contains a "Missing Report", dated 9 August 1944, prepared by Captain Thomas E. Wilson, Infantry. It states that on 6 August 1944, Captain White departed from Mayenne; that his intended destination was the Regimental Command Post in the vicinity of St. Suzanne; and that his last known whereabouts was Montsura. The resume of circumstances surrounding his disappearance follows:

"On way to Regt. C. P. when jeep was fired upon.
Driver was killed, W. O. J. G. Bell, a passenger, wounded
and Capt. White is missing--no trace of him being found."

Under "Statements of Witnesses, if Any" this notation appears: "W. O. J. G. William Bell (Wounded - Evacuated)."

3. A confidential letter, dated 5 June 1945, (File: AG 201, White, Paul, 0391998 (5 Jun 45)) was dispatched from this office to Warrant Officer (Jg) William H. Bell requesting information concerning Captain White. His reply, dated 13 June 1945, reveals the following information:

"2. On August 6, 1944 near Mayenne, France time about 2130, the Capt. was driving our Jeep, our regular T4 driver was riding in the right front seat and I was riding in the rear seat. Our Regiment had been formed into a task force. The first Bn. was leading it. We had started forward to the first Bn. when we were ambushed at a cross road by a small German patrol. We

were fired on with a machine gun and bazooka. The first burst killed the T4 and hit me in 4 places, and at the same time knocked the T4 and I out of the Jeep into the ditch by the side of the road. The Capt. was still in the vehicle and finally stopped at the edge of the road. The Germans were firing all the time. When the vehicle stopped the Capt. made no attempt to get out of the vehicle. The Germans quit firing and after waiting awhile came up to the Jeep and pulled the Capt. out and took him away with them. I'm sure that he must have been wounded, but how bad I don't know. I was told later in a letter from Lt. Martin J. Manhoff of the same Regiment and Company that his helmet was found near the Jeep with blood on it. They searched all around the area for any signs of him or his body, but none could be found. That was the last time that I had any kind of contact with Capt. White."

4. The AG 201 file also contains a letter from Captain White's wife to this office, dated 3 December 1944, in which she states that her husband had mentioned Harry Wright as his driver.

(War Department records show that Technician Fourth Grade Harry Wright, 18,071,010 was reported as killed in action 6 August 1944, by ETO Shipment No. 171.)

5. Mayenne is located in northwestern France at approximately 48° 18' N - 0° 36' W. Montsurs is about twelve miles southeast of Mayenne.

6. An examination of the files of this person in Casualty Branch and Officers' Branch, AGO, and of the Index in Prisoner of War Information Bureau, PMCO, does not reveal any further information relevant to this review.

II. - CONCLUSIONS

1. Captain White and two others occupied a jeep which, on 6 August 1944, departed from Mayenne, in northwestern France. In the vicinity of Montsurs

(approximately twelve miles southeast of Mayenne), at about 2130 hours, an ambushed enemy patrol fired upon the jeep, killing the driver, and wounding a passenger, Warrant Officer Junior Grade William H. Bell. According to Mr. Bell's statement, the Germans pulled Captain White, who was wounded, out of the jeep, and took him away with them. Later, his bloody helmet was found near the jeep; however, a search of the area revealed no other trace of Captain White.

2. Although it is twelve months since Captain White became missing in action, and approximately three months since the cessation of hostilities in Europe, no report has been received in the War Department to indicate that he is alive.

3. In view of the foregoing facts and circumstances, it is concluded that this person may not reasonably be presumed to be living.

III. - RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that a finding of death be made under the provisions of Section 5 of the Missing Persons Act in the case of Captain Paul White, 0391998, Infantry, and that this finding show the presumed date of death to be 7 August 1945.

Just before sundown, at about 2000 on the evening of 6 August 1944, Capt. Paul White, O-391998, WOJG William H. Bell, W-2105527, and Tec 4 Harry Wright, 18071010, were traveling south towards the town of Monsours, France in a gap in the column of the 357th Combat Team. This gap was six or eight miles deep and was between the 1st and 2nd Battalions of the 357th CT.

Capt. White was preceded in the line of march, by a few minutes by Major Paul McKinley, Regimental S-4. Major McKinley was stopped by some French people, who reported some Germans about a kilometer west of the road on which the 357th Combat Team was moving. Major McKinley resumed the march without incident, but evidently the jeep in which Capt. White and Mr. Bell were riding was attacked.

The 2nd Battalion 357th Infantry cleared the road the following morning. Mr. Bell, who had been riding in the rear seat of the jeep, was wounded in both arms and had escaped by falling into a ditch on the left side of the road. Tec 4 Wright, the driver, had been killed. His death was certified to by a Battalion Surgeon. Capt. White could not be found. Mr. Bell was in a dazed condition and could throw no light on Capt. White's disappearance.

The only item belonging to Capt. White that was found on the scene of the attack, was his helmet. The helmet had a bullet hole through each side, and there was blood and hair inside the liner. It was identified by Capt. White's serial number stamped on the inside of it.

There was no trace of the vehicle, and there is no record in this organization that it has been recovered.

It is believed that Capt. White was seriously wounded and taken prisoner and perhaps died of wounds.

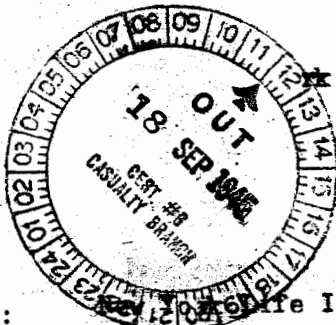

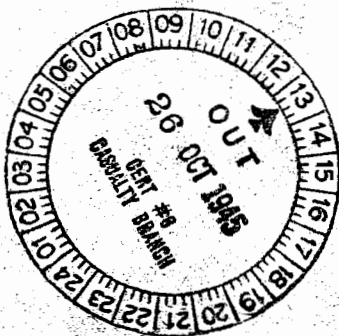

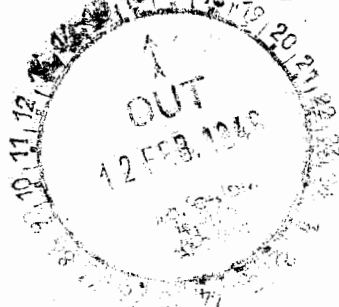

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

SUBJECT: Review of Circumstances Surrounding the Disappearance of
Captain Paul White, 0391998, Infantry.

1. Captain Paul White, 0391998, Service Company, 357th Infantry was reported missing in action on 6 August 1944, in France, by ETO Shipment No. 164, and under the provisions of Section 5 of the Missing Persons Act, was presumed dead by S. R. & D., No. 3786 /See Memorandum for Chief, Casualty Branch, dated 7 Aug 1945; file: AG-704 - Dead (7 Aug 45)/.

2. This officer's AG 201 file contains a "Missing Report", dated 9 August 1944, prepared by Captain Thomas E. Wilson, Infantry. It states that on 6 August 1944, Captain White departed from Mayenne; that his intended destination was the Regimental Command Post in the vicinity of St. Suzanne; and that his last known whereabouts was Montsurs. The resume of circumstances surrounding his disappearance follows:

"On way to Regt. C. P., when Jeep was fired upon.
Driver was killed, W.O.J.G. Bell, a passenger, wounded
and Capt. White is missing--no trace of him being found."

Under "Statements of Witness, if Any" this notation appears: "W.O.J.G.
William Bell (Wounded - Evacuated)."

3. A letter, dated 5 June 1945, (File: AG 201, White, Paul, 0391998 (5 Jun 45)) was dispatched from this office to Warrant Officer (JG) William H. Bell requesting information concerning Capt White. His reply, dated 13 June 1945, reveals the following information:

"2. On August 6, 1944 near Mayenne, France time about 2130, the Capt. was driving our Jeep, our regular T4 driver was riding in the right front seat and I was riding in the rear seat. Our Regiment had been formed into a task force. The first Bn. was leading it. We had started forward to the first Bn. when we were ambushed at a cross road by a small German patrol. We were fired on with a machine gun and bazooka. The first burst killed the T4 and hit me in 4 places, and at the same time knocked the T4 and I out of the Jeep into the ditch by the side of the road. The Capt. was still in the vehicle and finally stopped at the edge of the road. The Germans were firing all the time. When the vehicle stopped the Capt. made no attempt to get out of the vehicle. The Germans quit firing and after waiting awhile came up to the Jeep and pulled the Capt. out and took him away with

them. I'm sure that he must have been wounded, but how bad I don't know. I was told later in a letter from Lt. Martin J. Manhoff of the same Regiment and Company that his helmet was found near the Jeep with blood on it. They searched all around the area for any signs of him or his body, but none could be found. That was the last time that I had any kind of contact with Capt. White."

4. The following report is taken from a Clearance Casualty Plan Questionnaire, dated 30 August 1945, and is quoted in full:

"Just before sundown, at about 2000 on the evening of 6 August 1944, Capt Paul White, O-391998, WOJG William H. Bell W-2105527, and Tec 4 Harry Wright 18071010, were traveling south towards the town of Montsours, France in a gap in the column of the 357th Combat Team. This gap was six or eight miles deep and was between the 1st and 2nd Battalions of the 357th CT.

"Capt. White was preceded in the line of march, by a few minutes by Major Paul McKinley, Regimental S-4. Major McKinley was stopped by some French people, who reported some Germans about a kilometer west of the road on which the 357th Combat Team was moving. Major McKinley resumed the March, without incident, but evidently the jeep in which Capt White and Mr. Bell were riding was attacked.

"The 2nd Battalion 357th Infantry cleared the road the following morning. Mr. Bell, who had been riding in the rear seat of the jeep was wounded in both arms and had escaped by falling into a ditch on the left side of the road. Tec 4 Wright the driver, had been killed. His death was certified to by a Battalion Surgeon. Capt White could not be found. Mr. Bell was in a dazed condition and could throw no light on Capt White's disappearance.

"The only item belonging to Capt. White that was found on the scene of the attack, was his helmet. The helmet had bullet hole through each side, and there was blood and hair inside the liner. It was identified by Capt. White's serial number stamped on the inside of it.

"There was no trace of the vehicle, and there is no record in this organization that it has been recovered.

"It is believed that Capt. White was seriously wounded and taken prisoner and perhaps died of wounds later."

In view of the elapsed period of time without any further information pertaining to Captain White, it appears that in all probability he is dead, either killed during the engagement with the enemy or having survived his wounds, died of some unknown causes at a later date. However, there are no known eyewitnesses to his actual fate, and since the known circumstances immediately preceding his disappearance is not conclusive of death, any final decision as to his status is contingent upon the finding of his remains or evidence made a matter of record by the enemy. However, as indicated above, a search of official burial records failed to reveal the recovery of any remains, to date, which could be identified as those of subject person. Nor has any evidence been received either before or after cessation of hostilities to indicate that subject person was ever in the hands of the enemy.

7. In view of the foregoing, it is concluded that the information now of record in the Department of the Army does not warrant the issuance of an official report of death, under the provisions of Section 9 of the Missing Persons Act.

Information contained in the Casualty Clearance Plan indicates that Capt White's vehicle with two other passengers was traveling toward Montours. The vehicle was ambushed by the enemy and the driver killed. One passenger was wounded but escaped and managed to return to his unit. A search of the area where this incident occurred was made shortly after and Capt White's steel helmet and helmet liner were recovered. Condition of this helmet indicated that he had sustained a serious head wound. There was no further trace of subject casualty or the vehicle in which he was riding when the attack took place. Organizational records indicate that subject vehicle was never recovered. A field investigation was conducted in the appropriate area in Aug 1947 with negative results. Remains recovered from this area in an unknown status have either been identified or declared Unidentifiable. It is logical to conclude that Capt Paul White was wounded and taken prisoner by the enemy in the vicinity of Montours, France on 6 Aug 1944, that he later died from his wounds and that his remains were disposed of by the enemy at an unknown location, in a manner which precludes recovery. The fact that field investigation was negative and the fact that there are no unknowns on record that may be associated with the subject casualty

would tend to substantiate this conclusion: It is therefore recommended that this case be deemed Non-Recoverable.

NARRATIVE

On 22 August 1947, an investigation conducted by the undersigned investigating officer resulted in negative answers as to the whereabouts of Captain Paul White, MIA 6 August 1944, at La Vannerie, commune of La Basouge des Alleux, department of Mayenne, France. Everyone contacted was more than willing to talk about the death and burial of T/5 Harry Wright. However, no one interviewed throughout the four communes near La Vannerie were able to shed any light on the possible location of the isolated grave of any American soldier.

Numerous inhabitants of each commune were questioned, and the investigation was completed by obtaining a statement from the Mairie of the commune.

Farmer, Mr Gerault (statement attached) very willingly told about certain events and the finding of the remains of T/4 Wright. However, he knew nothing which would help in tracing the actions of Captain Paul White and the jeep.

Unless further information from official sources is forthcoming, it is useless to try to trace through civilian sources the possible location of the remains of Captain White. Unless more information is obtained on this matter, it is recommended the case be closed.
