I wish to explain that my father is old, has a weak heart and is rather deaf. As I explained to you, it was my brother's wish to spare his parents any grief and he asked us to keep any bad news from them. Therefore, in view of this, my sisters and I feel it is our sacred duty to our dead brother to keep this knowledge from them. The miraculous medicine which is keeping my parents alive is the hope that some day soon their only son will return to them. Also, if we know that we are able to keep this from them, we will be able to carry on. My brother was killed but we too are war casualties even though our wound does not show or bleed. In view of the circumstances outlined above and in my previous letter, I believe it is proof enough that I should be allowed to fill in the necessary form. The request is a small one to compensate for the great sacrifice we have made and with your help May 11 and June 15th will be Mother and Father's day every day for I believe it is not too much to ask for two old. sick people who have very little left but hope. During my brother's life in the Army, it was his wish that we do everything in our power to keep my Mother, who is very ill, from worrying about him and for this reason I was made beneficiary. A few days before his death, I received a letter reminding me of my promise.

Fearing the shock might kill my Mother, she was not informed of the death of her only son and up to this writing, my parents do not know.

While my sisters and I desire to have my brother's body returned here and buried in our family plot, we would like to know how long it would take before this would be done and if we could defer this until some later date and get in touch with the Department then. It is our wish not to do anything during my Mother's life time. She is still very ill and getting worse all the time.

Being able to spare my Mother this grief has made it a little easier for us to bear our burden and if the War Department can do anything to help us, it will be greatly appreciated.

For the reason stated above, will you please be good enough to forward all correspondence in this connection to me at the above address and mark all your records accordingly.


