The \$75 maximum allowance by the Government toward interment expenses includes but is not limited to the payment of one or more of the following items: Hearse hire from the railroad station to your home, the funeral home, church, cemetery, or any other place designated by you; vault; church services; newspaper notices; transportation for friends and relatives to and from cemetery; and the services of a funeral director.
- 4. Reimbursement by the Government is made only to the person who paid from his personal funds the expenses of or incident to interment in a private or civilian cemetery. Receipted bills are not required to accompany this form. Any expenses over and above the \$75 maximum must be borne by the person who incurred or paid the additional expenses.

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

Your letter pertaining to the remains of your former husband, the late Technician Fifth Grade Albert H. Goodrich, has come to my attention.

The official report of burial received in this office indicates that the remains of your former husband, were originally interred in the temporary cemetery established at Gela, Sicily in the locality in which he died.

The remains buried in these many small and scattered cemeteries must necessarily be concentrated in larger, centrally located cemeteries, close to line of transportation as the first phase in "The Return of World War II Dead Program." During this essential transfer and reburial, the remains are under the constant care and protection of military escorts and every known method employed to preserve their identity. Pending final determination of disposition of the remains, they are carefully reburied in peaceful and beautiful environment dedicated to our honored dead, constantly guarded and cared for by our Army.

Thus, in conformity with The Program, the remains of your former husband have been disinterred from their original resting place and reburied in Plot NI-C, Row 29, Grave 346, in the United States Military Cemetery Mt. Soprano, Paestum, Italy, located approximately twenty-two miles southeast of Salerno, Italy.

As you were previously informed the Department of the Army is legally required to recognize the disposition right of Mr. Edgar A. Goodrich who, according to our records is the only authorized next of kin having the legal right to direct the disposition of the remains of your former husband.



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

I am enclosing copies of letters which I have received in regard to this.

One which states as soon as hostilities permit that I would be notified of latest shipping instructions it didn't say anything about "If i should remarry". The other states that I have no right and states who does have.

Surely there is someway, something that I can do in order to get his body returned. My future happiness depends on it. My husband's last words to me were that he would be back. We had only been married a few months when he was shipped out and only a year and a manth when he was killed I felt that he would want me to be happy and his brother has been as good to me as anyone in the world could be, he's a good husband, and a good father to out children. He' know's how much having his brothers body brought back means to me and is willing to do all that he can to get it brought back. Surely I'm not to regret marrying again for the rest of my life.

Dear Mrs. Goodrich:

Your letter of recent date to President Roosevelt, relative to your husband, Technician Fifth Grade Albert H. Goodrich, has been forwarded to this office for so much thereof as pertains to return of remains.

Please be advised that your husband was interred with full military honors in an American cemetery in the area in which he was serving, on July 25, 1943, at 6:00 pm, with Chaplain services. His grave was appropriately marked to preserve its identity. The cemetery is well cared for and under the immediate supervision of our military authorities. As casualties occur it is customary even under conditions of actual warfare, to accord reverent burial to the remains of the deceased with appropriate ceremony conducted by an Army Chaplain.

A notation has been made on the official records of this office that it is your desire to have the remains of your husband returned, if possible, to the United States for final interment after cessation of hostilities. At the proper time you will be contacted by this office in order to obtain the latest shipping instructions and action will be taken at that time to carry out your request. The remains will be prepared and shipped at Government expense to the place thus designated.

This office extends to you its deepest sympathy in the loss of your husband and may the meager information that we have furnished you be of some comfort in your hour of sorrow.

Dear President Roosevelt:

I am writing you, not knowning if you will ever see this or not, but I sincerely hope you do, and that you will answer it.

Yesterday I received a letter from the Secretary of War. Also The Certificate of The Purple Heart Awarded to my husband, Cpl Albert H. Goodrich for Military Merit and Wounds received in Action resulting in his death 10 July 43.

President Roosevelt, I'm writing to you to see if you can help me find out something. I've tried ever source possible, but know no more than I did to start. I work in The Army Emergency Relief Office, here in Atlanta, I see quite a few of these casualty letters being sent to the person designated as the one to be notified in case of emergency. I've read some of the copies that have been sent to this office. Never dreaming that I would receive one myself. On most of these letters I've noticed this sentence. "Upon Termination of the war consideration will be given to the return of his remains to this country." This was not on the letter I received, does not my husband deserve the same consideration?

I have received letters from boys in his outfit saying that it happened on land and from others saying on sea. I've heard it so many different ways that truthfully I don't know what to believe. I've been hoping and praying that there is a mistake somewhere. That some day he will come back. I'm leaving for Burlington, Vermont which is his home, the 19th of this month. If there is a mistake and I'm hoping there is I want to be there waiting for him when he comes home.

I'm not going to ask the place of his burial, because I know that is something you may not be able to reveal, but I am asking you to tell me was it on land or sea. Was his body found to be buried. I want to know so I can know how to plan about the return of his body to this country. I realize this cannot be done till after the war, but I want to know that there is a body to be returned. I want to save so I can see that he is returned to the land he loved so much as to give his life trying to protect it. Surely you can understand now why I'm writing this. I cannot believe it to be true till I know that he has been buried. That after the war I can bring him home. As his wife surely I have a right to know.

I will appreciate your answering this and you assistance in helping me to find out the things I asked.

I'm asking you to send you answer to, 72 Bank St. Burlington, Vt. For as I said before I will leave for there the 19th to live.

I appreciate your being so patient in reading this and what ever help you may be able to give in helping me to find out the truth. Untill I know that he was buried I will hope that he will come back. Thank you again and I will be looking to hear from you soon.



Remove all personal property; remove one identification tag, leave other on body in protected position (in case of enemy dead, leave ½ tag on body, forward ½ with personal effects). If no tag present, make notation of identifying data on form, protect in sealed bottle, can een, spent shell, or best available container, and bury with remains. If unidentified, take fingerprints of both hands; if this is not possible fill out tooth-chart and note height, weight, color of eyes and hair, tattoo marks, birthmarks, etc. and other data as serial no. of weapon, laundry marks, where body found, etc. Wrapbody in shelter half, mattress cover, or blanket when available.

2. BURIAL: Dig grave to a depth of five feet (hasty battlefield burials, to sufficient depth to prevent elements from exposing the body). Place only one body in a grave. Dig graves side by side, row behind row.

3. MARKING OF GRAVE: Fasten identification tag to temporary name peg and place at head of grave. For enemy dead, write data on peg. When pegs are not available, copy data on a piece of paper, place in bottle, spent shell, or other receptacle, seal tightly and place so as to mark and identify grave. If identification tag cannot be fastened to peg or placed in container, do not leave at grave but forward with report of burial. If only one tag is found on body, it should be buried with body. The information thereon should be written on marker or placed in container at head of grave. Do not use weapons or helmets to mark graves.

4. LOCATION OF GRAVE: Report burials in established cemeteries by plot, row, and grave number (or show on cemetery map). For all other burials prepare sketch in space provided below; and give location by means of map references, or by reference to prominent permanent landmarks. Information must be specific, accurate, complete. Stand at foot of grave facing head to determine bodies buried to the left and right.

5. PERSONAL EFFECTS: List only personal effects taken from body on the Burial Report form. Place these with information as to identity of owner, organization, emergency addressee, in personal effects bag, or wrap in handkerchief, towel, or other available material, and turn over to Graves Registration Service Personnel with report of burial. Government property is not to be included in personal effects but is to be turned in to Salvage Collecting Point.


