- 1. Reference is made to the case of the A-26 plane which crashed at Schwege, Germany, on 20 March 1945, killing all occupants, three bodies of which still remaining unidentified.
- 2. Our investigation reveals that only two members of the Office of Strategic Services were officially present on the plane, one being Staff Sergeant Frederick J. Brunner, USMCR, and the other being a European civilian, Kurt Gruber, alias Nowak. Descriptions are as follows:

STATEMENT.

On 20 March 1945, I saw one 2 motored plane about 1 km from my house. Later in the afternoon I went to the scence of the crashed plane, with a Russian civilian, on the right side of the plane I saw a dead man dressed in civilian clothes. On the left side was a dead american flyer, later another body was found in the medow 50 meters from the plane. The fourth man was found in the water a little way from the plane. And the fifth men was found one hundred meters from the plane.

All the papers that were found on the deceased were taken by the German Military. The man on the left of the plans was badly wounded in the right leg and the civilian was badley wounded in the right side of the head. None of the deceased were burned. The plane did not burn in the air or it did not explode.

The plane is still there but it is ampossible to investigate because the area around the plane is under water or moor.

The plane crashed about one o'clock in the morning

of the 20 March 1945.

STATEMENT

On the evening of the 20 of March 1945 I was ordered to look at an sirplane which had come down. The plane had come down near Schwege, a little distance from Hunteburg. With the policeman Pranghe who was acompanying us, we want to see the plane which was guarded by Mr. Winter, Schwege.

The plane was loosing height and came down slowly.

Through hitting the ground it was damaged and slipped into a little brock and was tatally destroyed. The only remaining part of the plane was the body.

After investigation it was found out, that it was a Douglas A 26, with 18 cylinder motor and one rudder, further it was niticed, that the plane was not hit by Anti-aircraft or fired upon by another plane. The members of the crew, believed to be 5, were dead.

The names which were identified through identification tags are as follows:

Nowak, Pawel, through German identification pass
Tresomer, " identification tag
Emmel, " ix "
Walsh, " "
Brunner " naby pass

4 of the members were in soldiers out fit, Nowekwere civilian clothes. 2 members of the crew were lying beside the plane the other about 20 to 150 meters away. The bodies showed some injuries, probably from the crash, some of them had arms and legs brocken.

All papers and personal effects taken from these bodies were handed over to the Kommandant, except these of the civilian Nowak. The papers of Nowak taken by policeman Pranghe were hand ed to Kommandant Hospelt, were looked through and later handed over to the secret service. Police Pranghe has taken care of a greater amount of papers, forms, stencils, small headphones an and a small microphone, as well as RM. 7000.00 and one pound not note (English mony).

From papers found on Nowak it could be seen, that he had to be dropped as a spy. For this purpose he was using an automatic paracjute, as all the other members had an ordinary parachute.

From a letter written on paper of the Herman Göring-Norks at Prag, could be seen that after a telephone conversation with this factory and another factory at Mülheim, Nowak was to be transerred to there. Another letter was written to a certain gentleman in the factory and should be used as a letter of recommandation. On Nowak was found a German identification pass it showed, that he was of Czech nationality.

The statement given by the wife of the farmer Kruse, who is living nearest to the place of the accident was, that the plane must have come down already in the night of 18 - 19 March 1945, because during this night she heard a great noise.

As the moor is some distante away, the plane had not been n noticed until the 20 of March 1945.



Kurt Gruber alias Pawel Nowak, an O.S.S. agent, was aboard A/C 42-22524, which crew consisted of three Army personnel and one member of the Marine Corps, Pl. Sgt. Brunner.

Civilians who witnessed the crash state that an A-26 plane went down near Hunteburg, Germany on 20 March 1945.* Five bodies (including one in civilian dress) were recovered and identified by name; Tresemer, Emmel and Walch through ID tags, Brunner through a Navy pass and Nowak (GRUBER) through German identification papers. Burial location was reported as the Achmer Military Cemetery.

Five remains associated with this case were recovered from the Achmer Airdrome Military Cemetery, i.e., three known, Emmel, Walch & Tresemer and unknowns X-756 & X-757 Neuville. The case of X-756 has been released to the Navy for identification as Pl. Sgt. Brunner through favorable tooth chart comparison. Tooth chart accomplished for X-757 compares negatively with that of Brunner.

- 3. Missing Air Crew Report No. 13281, dated 26 March 1945, reveals that the persons named in paragraph 1b and a member of the Marine Corps constituted the crew of an A-26 type aircraft, number 43-22524, which departed Harrington, England, on a secret mission to the Dummer Lake area in Germany. The aircraft was not seen or heard from after the take-off, 19 March 1945, at 2320 hours. The weather was given as "Clouds: 9/10, base 700 feet. Visibility: 3000 yards. Weather: Light continuous rain."
- a. The Ag 201 file of Lieutenant Emmel contains a letter, dated 17 September 1945, to this office from his mother, which states that she had been told that her son was hospitalized. In reply to an inquiry, AGPC-S 201 Emmel, Oliver H. (30 Jan 46), from this office, Mrs. Emmel, by letter dated 2 February 1946, stated that she had upon further investigation, found that her information was untrue and had been given to her as a means of consolation.

3. Missing Air Grew Report No. 132Md, dated 26 March 1945, reveals that the persons named in paragraph 15 and a member of the Marine Corps constituted the crew of an A-25 type aircraft, number 43-22524, which departed Harrington, England, on a secret mission to the Dummer Lake area in Germany. The aircraft was not seen or heard from after the take-off, 19 March 1945, at 2320 hours. The weather was given as "Clouds: 9/10, base 700 feet. Visibility: 3000 yards. Weather: Light continuous rain."

e. The Ag 201 file of Lieutenant Emmel contains a letter, dated 17
September 1945, to this office from his mother, which states that she had been
told that her son was hospitalized. In reply to an inquiry, AGFC-S 201 Emmel,
Cliver H. (30 Jan 46), from this office, Mrs. Emmel, by letter dated 2 February 1946,
stated that she had upon further investigation, found that her information was
untrue and had been given to her as a means of consolation.

12. An examination of the files of these persons in Casualty Branch, Officers Branch and Enlisted Branch, AGO, does not reveal any further information relevant to this review.

II - CONCLUSIONS

- l. Subject persons became missing in action on 19 March 1945 while they were crew-members or sole occupants of aircraft which were on mission over Belgium and Germany. A Missing Air Crew Report has been received in connection with the loss of each aircraft; and statements concerning the disappearance of the person or persons aboard the plane have been obtained from one or more known survivors of each aircraft in which there was a crew. The reports are highly indicative of death. One plane, a B-17, was last sighted over Belgium; another, an A-26, was last seen at its take-off on a mission in Germany; returned crew-members stated that their B-24 crashed in Germany with the missing members still in the plane, four of whom had no parachute on when last seen.
- 2. In view of the foregoing facts and circumstances, together with the fact that no report has been received in the War Department during the twelve months which have elapsed since the inception of the subject persons' missing in action status indicating that they are alive, it is concluded that they may not "reasonably be presumed to be living" within the meaning of Section 5 of the Missing Persons Act.

III - RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that findings of death be made under the provisions of Section 5 of the Missing Persons Act in the cases of the persons named in Part I, paragraph 1, above, and that these findings show the presumed date of death, in each case, to be 20 March 1946.

- 1. A/C 43-22524 crashed in the vicinity of Schwege, Germany, on 20 March 1945.
- 2. The A/C carried four crew members and one European civilian. All five were killed in the crash.
- 3. With the identity of X-756 as Pl. Sgt. Brunner, all four crew members have been identified and reburied as Knowns in USMC Neuville.
- 4. Civilian Gruber is the only remaining casualty of the subject A/C and X-757 is the only remaining deceased Unknown disinterred from the cemetery at Achmer Airdrome that can definitely be connected with this A/C. Also, X-757 is the only deceased Unknown that is assumed to be a civilian.





Clothing consists of an English outer flying suit, a 2-piece dark blue serge flying suit and vest of the same material, a heavy necktie from a shop in Berlin, Germany, a green cotton shirt and a jacket of brown wool gabardine, all of unfamiliar type which is not ordinary U.S.issue.

Clothing was checked by Captain SAWKINS, R.A.F. British Liaison Officer with A.G.R.C. Capt. Sawkins definitely identified the outer flying garment as British but could not identify any other clothing as definitely British.

It is possible this may be an allied flyer or even an O.S.S. representative.

Portions of clothing are forwarded for more definite examination.



STATEMENT.

On 20 March 1945, I saw one 2 motored plane about 1 km from my house. Later in the afternoon I went to the scence of the crashed plane, with a Russian civilian, on the right side of the plane I saw a dead man dressed in civilian clothes. On the left side was a dead american flyer, later another body was found in the medow 50 meters from the plane. The fourth man was found in the water a little way from the plane. And the fifth man was found one hundred meters from the plane.

All the papers that were found on the deceased were taken by the German Military. The man on the left of the plane was badly wounded in the right leg and the civilian was badley wounded in the right side of the head. None of the deceased were burned. The plane did not burn in the air or it did not explode.

The plane is still there but it is ampossible to investigate because the area around the plane is under water or moor.

The plane crashed about one o'clock in the morning

of the 20 March 1945.

STATEMENT

.

On the evening of the 20 of March 1945 I was ordered to look at an airplane which had come down. The plane had come down near Schwege, a little distance from Hunteburg. With the policeman Pranghe who was acompanying us, we went to see the plane which was guarded by Mr. Winter, Schwege.

The plane was loosing height and came down slowly,
Through hitting the ground it was damaged and slipped into
a little brook and was totally destroyed. The only remaining
part of the plane was the body.

After investigation it was found out, that it was a Douglas A 26, with 18 cylinder motor and one rudder, further it was noticed, that the plane was not hit by Anti-aircraft or fired upon by another plane. The members of the crew, believed to be 5, were dead.

The names which were identified through identification tags are as follows:

Nowak, Pawel, through German identification passTresemer, "identification tag

Brunner, "navy pass -

5 of the members were in soldiers outfit, Nowak wore civilian clothes. 2 members of the crew were lying beside the plane, the other about 20 to 150 meters away. The bodies showed some injuries, probably from the crash, some of them had arms and legs broken.

With the help of a laborer of the farmer Kruse and a Russian prisoner of war, the bodies were taken out of the moor and brought to the Achmer Mil. Cemetery.

All papers and personal effects taken frome these bodies were handed over to the Kommandant, except these of the civilian Nowak. The papers of Nowak taken by policeman Pranghe were handed to Kommandant Hospelt, werelooked throught and later handed over to the secret service. Policeman Pranghe has taken care of a greater amount of papers, forms, stencils, small headphones and a small microphone, as well as RM. 7000,00 and one pound note (English mony).

From papers found on Nowak it could be senn, that he had to be dropped as a spy. For this purpose he was using an automatic parachute, as all the other members had an ordinary parachute.


From a letter written on paper of the Hermann-Goering-Works at Prag, could be seen that after a telephone conversation with this factory and another factory at Muelheim, Nowak was to be transferred to there. Another letter was written to a certain gentleman in the factory and should be used as a letter of recommendation. On Nowak was found a German identification pass, it showed, that he was of Czech nationality.

The statement given by the wife of the farmer Kruse, who is living nearest to the place of the accident was, that the plane must have come down already in the night of 18-19 March 1945, because during this night she heard a great noise.


As the moor is some distant away, the plane had not been noticed until the 20 of March 1945.




