

It is regretted that, through an error in this Office, our letter dated 22 March 1950, was incorrect with respect to your last name, which was shown as Rosche.

All the records of this Office have now been changed to show your last name as Roshe instead of Rosche. Therefore, in the future, all correspondence will be addressed to you accordingly.

My personal effects and furniture and those of my late husband, Colonel Albert W. Pashe (O-113,726) were removed from Apt. 626 Darrchester House, Washington D.C. on Oct. 11, 1942 and shipped to Los Angeles, California. They were put in storage at the Bekins Van & Storage Co. warehouse until such time as I might select a place of residence.

I was ill and my husband was transferred to the European Theater of Operations, where he died on July 10, 1943.

Before leaving my husband told me we had the privilege of having our effects removed from the warehouse and delivered to a residence by the Quartermaster Depot. Dept. at Fort Mac Arthur and thus complete the shipment.

I have located an apartment and called the Quartermaster and was told by one of the girls they no longer had authority for removing the goods from warehouse to residence. She said something about a ruling effective since July.

They were still under the impression the effects of the widow were delivered to a place of residence at government expense.

I expect to take possession of an apartment on December 15, 1943, and want the delivery of effects made on December 16, 1943. In case there is not sufficient time to hear from you shall I go ahead and let Bekins take care of the transportation and then be reimbursed by the Quartermaster Depot Dept. - or was the Quartermaster Depot at Fort Mac Arthur correct in stating that they would not accept the responsibility?

The address to which I wish the delivery made is 1140 South Westmoreland Los Angeles, Calif. and the storage company is Bekins Van & Storage Co. Pico & Crenshaw, Los Angeles, Calif.

Referring to your letter of the 22nd ultimo addressed to the Manager of our Cheltenham Branch, the matter is somewhat unusual inasmuch as although it is a Joint Account, we have had no contact with Mrs. E. Mae Roshe. We think, however, we should be entitled to treat it as an ordinary Joint Account, in which case the answers to your three questions are as follows:-

- (a) It could be considered a survivorship account and Mrs. Roshe could withdraw the balance on her identity being established.
- (b) As it is a permitted registered account by the Bank of England, provided we were satisfied that the only monies paid in to the account had been the personal funds of the officer concerned, the balance could be withdrawn by Mrs. Roshe in dollars.
- (c) We consider the best procedure would be for you to communicate with Mrs. Roshe and obtain her authority for our paying the money to you, or, alternatively, if she wished the money to be paid to her direct, it could probably be done through your agency as regards establishing her identity, etc.



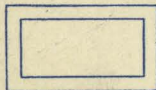
