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

Reference is made to our letter dated 21 July 1959, addressed to your father, Mr. Alex Rados in your care, requesting disposition instructions for the remains of your brother, Private First Class Steve Rados.

Your brother's remains have been casketed and are being held pending receipt of Mr. Rados' instructions either to inter the remains overseas in the Ardennes American Cemetery and Memorial, Neuville-en-Condroz, Belgium, or to return the remains to any town or city in the United States for burial in a private or national cemetery. These instructions have not been received to date. We realize that this is a difficult decision to make under normal circumstances, and in view of the lapse of time since Pfc Rados' death, it is, perhaps, even more difficult to arrive at a decision.

Dear Mrs. Evanko:

I am writing to you in reference to your former husband, Private First Class Steve Rados, who lost his life in the European area during World War II.

At the close of World War II, many of our deceased servicemen were recovered and buried in accordance with desires of their next of kin. A number of our servicemen, however, who were killed in action were buried by the enemy in unmarked graves in Prisoner of War cemeteries or in isolated graves in the areas where they fell. Our Graves Registration Service conducted many searches for our deceased personnel who were buried under these conditions, but not all of the graves could be located at the time the searches were made.

Official records reveal that Private First Class Steve Rados, SN 35 026 219, a member of Company I, 36th Armored Infantry Regiment, 3rd Armored Division, was killed in action on 30 June 1944 in the vicinity of "Hill 192", St. Clair, France, which is located within a few miles of St. Lo, France. He was struck by enemy cross fire when he moved through an opening to fire his rifle. Many searches were conducted by our Graves Registration Service personnel in an effort to recover his remains as well as the remains of others reported missing in the general area.

Even at this late date developments occur in former battle areas which result in the location of graves of our deceased servicemen. Such an event has taken place in Private Rados' case. Reports received in this Office reveal that the German War Graves Commission, during exhumation operations near St. Lo, France, discovered human remains, together with your former husband's identification tag and other bits of American clothing and equipment. The German Officials contacted United States Army Officials in Germany and released the remains so that anthropological examinations could be made in the United States Army Mortuary in Frankfurt, Germany. Comparisons were made of the physical and dental characteristics of the remains against the Army medical and dental records for all our casualties who were reported missing in the general area, as well as against similar records for Private Rados.



Therefore, after a careful consideration of all the evidence in the case, your son's identification was established.



I know that considerable anxiety has been experienced since word was first received concerning your son's death in the European area, and it is earnestly hoped that you may obtain some consolation from the knowledge that his remains are now in our custody. They have been casketed and are being held overseas pending instructions from you, either for return to the United States or for permanent interment in the Ardennes American Cemetery and Memorial, Neuville-en-Condroz, Belgium.

It is requested, therefore, that you advise this Office:

- a. The name of the city or town to which the deceased should be delivered and the address of the funeral director engaged to receive his remains, or
- b. The name and location of national cemetery, if it is desired that direct shipment be made to the superintendent of a national cemetery, or
- c. That the remains should be interred in the Ardennes American Cemetery and Memorial, Neuville-en-Contros, Belgium.

For your convenience, the disposition instructions may be sent by collect telegram and should be addressed to:

If the remains are interred in the Ardennes American Cemetery and Memorial the Army will make all arrangements and pay all costs involved. Burials in such overseas cemeteries is permanent and removal therefrom at a subsequent date, either at government or private expense, is not permitted.

If the remains are returned to the United States, the Army will bear expense of transportation to any city or town desired or to any United States National Cemetery having grave space. In addition, an allowance for costs incident to interment is authorized and is payable as reimbursement to the person whose funds are used to defray such expenses. This allowance may not exceed \$200.00 if burial is in a civilian cemetery; \$125.00 if remains are shipped to a funeral director prior to interment in a national cemetery or \$75.00 if remains are shipped direct to a national cemetery for interment. A list of national cemeteries is inclosed for your information.

Upon receipt of your disposition instructions, you may be assured that the Department of the Army will exert every effort to comply with the instructions.

A Board of Officers appointed by paragraph 1, Division Order No. 10, dated 27 May 1959, (Tab A) convened at 1000 hours 17 June 1959 and after consideration of the following factors, approved the identification of Unknown X-9302 Frankfurt Mausoleum, as PFC STEVE (NMI) RADOS, 35 026 219, Armored Infantry.

SUMMARY

Private First Class STEVE RADOS, SN 35 026 219, a member of Co "I", 36th Armored Infantry Regiment, 3rd Armored Division, participating in the Normandy Invasion, was reported MIA 30 June 1944. Report of Death was subsequently issued showing date of death as 30 June 1944.

Official records reveal that PFC RADOS was reported KIA when the squad of which he was a member was pinned down by the enemy, and as he moved through an opening to fire his rifle he was struck by enemy cross-fire in the vicinity of "St Clair"*, France. Additional information in file (extr from AG 201 file) indicates that PFC RADOS was killed in the vicinity of Hill 192. Both "St Clair" and Hill 192 are within a few miles of St-Lo, France. (See Overlay & Coords - Tab B.) St-LO is located within the Department of MANCHE, France.

American GRS teams conducted numerous searches throughout the Department of MANCHE, but none of the remains recovered could be associated with PFC RADOS. Findings of Nonrecoverability were approved 15 December 1950.

In 1958 the Normandy Detachment of the German War Graves Commission reported the discovery of remains of an American deceased during exhumation operations in La Luzerne, near St-Lo, France. According to a member of the Normandy Detachment, the remains (minus the skull) were recovered from an isolated grave on the property of Mr. Rene Hennequin of La Luzerne. One ID Tag for STEVE RADOS, 35026219, was found with the remains as well as portions of US Ground Forces clothing and equipment. The remains, designated S&R #5022, Unknown X-9302, were recovered the latter part of 1957 or early 1958. (Tab C - June 1958 Report.)

Several years prior to discovery of the above referenced remains - in 1946 or 1947 - Mr. Hennequin had unearthed a skull on his property during spring plowing. Assuming that the skull belonged to one of three German deceased previously recovered by a German de-mining team, Mr. Hennequin had turned the skull over to a member of the de-mining team and was told that it would be

buried with the three Germans in the local cemetery. When this matter was brought to the attention of the GWGC during exhumation operations in 1957/1958, the area where the skull had been found was re-searched, and it was then that the remains bearing the ID Tag of STEVE RADOS were discovered, and Hq US Army QMMS (Europe) was immediately notified.

The bodies of the three German deceased were exhumed from the local church cemetery, but the missing skull was not found with their remains. A former member of the German de-mining team, now residing in East Germany, was contacted and in response to the letter of inquiry he replied that he believed that the skull was interred in close proximity to the three Germans. A second search of the church cemetery on 24 May 1958 resulted in recovery of the skull, buried at a depth of approximately 15cm, near the foot of the middle German grave. The mandible was not recovered. (See sketch - Tab D.)

Initial processing of the two separate recoveries at the Frankfurt Identification Laboratory revealed that the 1st cervical vertebra was missing; therefore, post-cranial articulation was incomplete. There was, however, a favorable contour association between the foramen magnum at the base of the skull and the 2nd cervical vertebra. The age factors of the skull and the skeletal remains were in agreement. (Tab E)

Comparison of dental/physical data for Unknown X-9302 (consolidated)(Tab F) with corresponding characteristics recorded for STEVE RADOS revealed a marked similarity; however, in view of the circumstances of recovery, plus the absence of dental restorations or extractions for either the UNKNOWN or RADOS, it was considered advisable to contact the next of kin in an effort to clarify specific points regarding dentition and to confirm, if possible, the existence of a cervical rib** or any unusual condition of the vertebrae which might have been disclosed thru X-rays, if available.

Inquiries failed to reveal the existence of X-rays; however, as a result of the inquiry to the next of kin, minor dental defects were clarified and two photographs of RADOS were furnished this Office. The photographs were in turn forwarded to the Army QMMS Identification Laboratory for anthropological examination and comparison with skull portions of Unknown X-9302. The results of this action prove beyond a doubt that the skull in question is that of PFC STEVE RADOS. All identifying factors pertaining to the major skeletal portions are in close agreement with corresponding data recorded for STEVE RADOS. (Tab G)

CONCLUSION:

The evidence presented in Supplemental Laboratory Report (with Exhibits "A" and "B"), and other related papers, provides unquestionable assurance that association as "tentatively" established is correct.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the identification of Unknown X-9302 Frankfurt Mausoleum be approved as the remains of PFC STEVE RADOS, SN 35 026 219, and that Findings of Non-recoverability be canceled.

Under provisions of AR 15-6, dated 25 July 1955, there is hereby established the Memorial Division Board of Review (hereinafter referred to as the Board) to assist the Chief, Memorial Division, in the resolution of special cases which involve the identifiability, nonidentifiability, or nonrecoverability of the remains of deceased persons.
- 2. <u>Membership</u>. The Board will consist of not less than 3 officers. The senior member present will serve as President of the Board. One member, as designated by the president, will act as recorder for the Board and will be responsible for the documentation of the findings of the Board. A majority of the members of the Board will constitute a quorum.
- 3. Authority. In the resolution of all cases referred to in paragraph l above, the Board will serve as the reviewing channel between the operating Branch and the Division Chief. The Board is authorized to review all such cases as are referred through it to the Division Chief. After documentation of its findings, the Board will recommend the approval of the Division Chief or his designated representative or return the case to the operating branch for reconsideration of its determinations.
- 4. Duties. The Board is charged with the following duties and responsibilities:
- a. Establish a set of standards and procedures to determine the adequacy, authenticity, and completeness of records which serve as an operating basis for the Board.
- b. Review case history reports concerning the identifiability of recovered remains as submitted by the operating branch.
- c. Review case history reports concerning the nonidentifiability of individual recovered remains and the nonidentifiability of individual remains from group recoveries.

- d. Review case history reports concerning the nonrecoverability of remains of persons in the following categories:
- (1) Persons for whom The Adjutant General has issued presumptive findings of death.
- (2) Persons known to be in a KIA status, whose remains, because of the circumstances of death, are determined to be nonrecoverable.
 - (3) Persons whose remains are officially reported lost at sea.
- e. Based upon its findings, either recommend the approval of the Division Chief, or return the case to the operating branch for further reconsideration of the case.
- 5. Convening of the Board. The Board will convene at the time and place designated by the president and will adjourn at his direction.
- 6. Rescission. Memorial Division Order No. 29, dated 19 September 1957, Subject: Memorial Division Board of Review, is rescinded.

Extract from OPENING ATTACK on ST-LO (11 July 44):

"...Observation was always a major problem for troops attacking in this country, especially when observation was needed for regulating the fires of supporting weapons or for coordinating air strikes. As a result, a few of the low hills had considerable tactical value. Particularly important were Hill 192, the narrow east-west ridges flanking the highway to Bayeux between Hill 192 and St-Lo, and the high ground on which lay the village of la Luzerne, two miles northeast of the city..."

"...The attack plan called for an effort that would begin on the right, near the sea, then widen progressively eastward in a series of blows by three of the four corps in line, on Army order. To reach the ultimate objectives would involve the greatest advance (some 20 miles) on the right, while the whole front pivoted on V Corps, east of St-Lo...At the start XIX Corps had two divisions in line, the 29th and 30th; the 35th was on its way to France, scheduled to reinforce their attack. The 3rd Armored Division was initially in army reserve, near Isigny..."

Extract from OMAHA BEACHHEAD (page 155) 12 - 13 June 44:

"...Three (plus) battalions of division artillery were to render close support for the 115th Infantry. That unit was ordered to attack across the Elle at 0500, its objectives St-Clair-sur-l'Elle and Couvains, in an operation which would protect the right flank of the 2nd Division as it advanced on Hill 192..."

"North of St-Clair-sur-Elle, the Germans had made maximum use of prepared positions, with well-placed fields for automatic fire. In the St-Jean-de-Savigny area, the enemy had employed mobile tactics, involving infiltration and counterattack by small units on the flanks of advancing U.S. forces. German artillery support was still weak, with some self-propelled guns in use. It was clear that the enemy was prepared to hold Hill 192 with every means at his disposal. The engagement at the Elle on 12-13 June was, in fact, a foretaste of the bitter fighting to come in this sector...Most of the 29th Division's 547 casualties for the 2 days were suffered in their first battle for the approaches to St-Lo. Five miles from that town on 13 June, the 29th Division entered it on 18 July, while Hill 192 was captured by the 2nd Division on 11 July only after costly fighting for every hedgerow on its slopes..."

Extract from STORY OF THE 2nd INFANTRY DIVISION - THE BLOODY HILL BEFORE ST-LO:

"...The battle for Hill 192, vital strongpoint on the way to St. Lo, was next. One rifle company succeeded in reaching the crest June 16 only to be driven back in the face of a withering counter-attack...Thickly covered with heavy foliage, the hill commanded a six-mile area. When (2nd Div) wrested precious territory from the Nazis, the breakthrough at St Lo, vital communications center just six miles away was set to follow two weeks later. The enemy had been fortifying Hill 192 for months. It was studded with foxholes, machine gun nests and expertly camouflaged observation points. Hedgerows sprouted along its gradual slope. Behind these, Germans huddled in dugouts...The taking of Hill 192 finally was achieved through coordinated efforts of infantry, artillery, tanks and engineers. The Air Force also helped by softening up the heights with dive-bombings. Simultaneously with the main assault, the regiment on the left flank executed a diversionary attack to mask the action that was to take place on a division front. The Hill was taken 11 July..."

- 1. The skull with the remains designated Unknown X-9302 was recovered separately in 1946 or 1947 by a farmer while cultivating his field in Normandy, France. At that time he presented it to a German burial party which had just interred three (3) German soldiers in the local churchyard cemetery. He was told that the skull would be buried with or near the German soldiers. In 1958 the German War Graves Commission removed the three (3) German remains from the churchyard cemetery and were informed at that time about the isolated skull recovery some eleven (11) years before. The German War Graves Commission was led to the approximate spot where the skull had been found and after extensive digging found a remains, less skull, with US Ground Force clothing and equipment and an identification tag for "STEVE RADOS - 35026219". A search at that time of the graves for the three (3) Germans failed to locate the isolated skull which had been buried with those remains but a subsequent search based on information from one of the original German burial party resulted in the recovery of the skull. It was found in a shallow burial adjacent to the foot-end of the middle German burial.
- 2. Circumstantial evidence indicates subject skull belongs with the remains in question. Positive association by post-cranial articulation is not possible as the first cervical vertebra was not recovered. There is a favorable comparison between the contour of the foramen magnum at the base of the skull and the relative contour of the second cervical vertebra. Dental association is positive in a limited sense as available dental records for Pfc RADOS only indicates subject casualty had no fillings and teeth R 16 and L 16 were missing. Although the mandible was not recovered it is apparent that tooth R 16 must have been absent as tooth R 8 above it has descended 5 mm from normal due to a lack of opposition from tooth R 16. The severe and irregular abrasion of the central incisors indicates this casualty had an "edge-to-edge" bite but this feature is not reflected in the limited dental records for Pfc RADOS.
- 3. Two (2) photographs have been provided by the family for comparison with the skull in this case to determine possible areas of similarity. An excellent comparison has been determined on the following characteristics:

- b. By equalizing the sizes of the lifetime views with those of the skull and superimposing one upon the other in their same aspects it is clearly evident that all contours and spacings are in excellent agreement.
- 4. Equalized photos as described above are hereby submitted as exhibits "A" and "B". The excellent comparison between the skull and lifetime photos when considered in conjunction with the facts of recovery leaves no question about this skull being that of Pfc Steve Rados.

- 1. Search and Recovery Case #5022-A and B pertains to a remains recently recovered at La Luzerne (A-8/T-56) near St. Lo. France. An identification tag for STEVE RADOS 35026219 T-41 T-42 was found with this decedent as well as US Ground Force clothing and equipment. Evidence indicates the skull alone was first found in 1946 or 1947 by a farmer. The skull was than considered as belonging with one of three German deceased who had been recovered nearby and buried in the local churchyard. Recently the German War Graves Mission, on learning of the earlier skull recovery, proceeded to search the area where the skull had been found. They recovered subject remains with ID tag for. RADOS and immediately notified this headquarters. An initial search of the nearby church cemetery, where the three Germans had been buried, failed to reveal the skull which was said to have been buried with the Germans. Contact was later made with one of the German personnel who had made the initial burials and is now living in East Germany. Although he couldn't give an exact location of the skull burial he did remember that it was in the immediate proximity of the three German burials. A second search made adjacent to these burials revealed the skull in a shallow burial near the foot end of the middle German burial.
- 2. The skull has been consolidated with subject remains and a tentative unknown number has been assigned this case as follows:

SR #5022 is now designated UNKNOWN X-9302 Frankfurt Mausoleum Grave 304

The absence of the first cervical vertebra prevents making a definite post-cranial articulation. It is apparent, however, that the skull belongs with this remains because of the favorable contour of the foramen magnum at the base of the skull and the relative contour of the second cervical vertebra. The age factors of the skull and the remains are in agreement.

The maxillary teeth present are in agreement with the limited dental data available which indicates no fillings and teeth R-16, L-16 being missing. Although the mandible was not recovered it is apparent that tooth R-16 must have been missing as tooth R-8 has dropped 5 mm from its normal position due to a lack of opposition from R-16. The rare presence of a cervical rib (left) is noted as well as the less rare anomaly of only 23 vertebrae wherein the 12th thoracic vertebra also serves as the 1st lumbar vertebra.

4. CAUSE OF DEATH: Small arms bullet wounds in the right pelvic bone and at the right shoulder were the apparent cause of death.


Dear Mrs. Ballas:

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
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

Dear Mrs. Evanko:

I am writing to you in reference to your former husband, the late Private First Class Steve Rados, who lost his life in the European Area during World War II.

The records indicate that your former husband, a member of Gompany "I", 36th Armored Infantry Regiment, was killed in action on 30 June 1944, as a result of enemy cross-fire in the vicinity of St. Clair sur Elle, France, near St. Lo.

In our letter of 4 January 1951, you were advised that all efforts to recover Steve's remains had failed and it was necessary to declare that his remains were not recoverable. However, recent operations by the German War Graves Commission resulted in the recovery of individual remains from an unmarked isolated grave at La Luzerne, near St. Lo, France, which were believed to be those of an American casualty. This association was based upon the finding of an identification tag for "STEVE RADOS, 35 026 219" with the remains as well as United States Ground Forces clothing and equipment. The German War Graves Commission made known their findings to United States authorities and the remains were transferred to our custody for examination in our scientifically equipped laboratories overseas.

Army records from various sources were assembled and made available to our identification personnel in order that they could have all facts pertaining to the case of Private First Class Rados. The remains were scientifically examined in our laboratories under the direction of a professional anthropologist and identification specialists. These examinations resulted in favorable comparision of dental and physical characteristics, shoe size, type of clothing and equipment with available identifying data recorded in the Army records of your former husband. During the examination, however, specific dental and physical characteristics found could not be verified with his military records. It will, therefore, be of great assistance to this Office if you can furnish any information which may have been recorded by your family dentist or doctor for him prior to his entry into the Army. This information should include such dental treatment as extractions, restorations and any pecularities of the

dentition of the teeth. Any X-rays of the teeth or of the chest area will also be of assistance. In the event your family dentist or doctor has destroyed any record of treatment for your former husband, then perhaps you could assist through personal knowledge and photographs. A complete description of Steve's teeth would help. For instance, if you recall whether his teeth were short, long or average in size, crowded. chipped or worn down in front. A close-up facial view photograph, reflecting a smiling or laughing expression, would be of great assistance. After the photograph has been examined and a copy made for his records. it will be promptly returned.

A similar request was made to the father, Mr. Alex Rados, Olmsted Falls, Ohio, on 4 February 1959. In a reply from Mrs. Anne Ballas, daughter of Mr. Rados, she advised that the information contained in our letter was not conveyed to her father because such news may have adverse affects due to his advanced years. Mrs. Ballas did furnish us a photograph of Private Rados; however, it did not show his teeth. In her letter, Mrs. Ballas also advised that one of Steve's front teeth was chipped but she could not recall whether it was on the right or left side of his mouth. Meither did she indicate whether it was an upper or lower front tooth. In this connection, perhaps you could be more specific as to the over-all description of his teeth. Any minute pecularity of his teeth that you may recall, regardless of how minor it may appear, will be of the utmost value.

I deeply regret the necessity of having to contact you in this matter as it tends to revive unpleasant memories of the past; however, I feel sure you can understand our efforts in trying to conclusively identify our honored war dead. In the event the information furnished by you leads to a positive association, it should be comforting to know that you have Contributed greatly to making the identification possible.

Your cooperation in this matter will be appreciated. For your conrenience in replying, I am enclosing an envelope which requires no postage.

However, recent operations by the German War Graves Commission resulted in the recovery of individual remains from an unmarked isolated grave at La Luzerne, near St. Lo, France, which were believed to be those of an American casualty. This association was based upon the finding of an identification tag for "STEVE RADOS, 35 026 219" with the remains as well as US Ground Forces clothing and equipment. The German War Graves Commission made known their findings to United States authorities and the remains were transferred to our custody for examination in our scientifically equipped laboratories overseas.

Army records from various sources were assembled and made available to our identification personnel in order that they could have all facts pertaining to your son's case. The remains were scientifically examined in our laboratories under the direction of a professional anthropologist and identification specialists. These examinations resulted in favorable comparison of dental and physical characteristics, shoe size, type of clothing and equipment with available identifying data recorded for your son in his Army records. During the examination, however, specific dental and physical characteristics found could not be verified with your son's military records. It will, therefore, be of great assistance to this Office if you can furnish any information which may have been recorded by your family dentist or doctor for him prior to his entry into the military service. This information should include such dental

treatment as extractions, restorations and any pecularities of the dentition of the teeth. Any X-rays of the teeth or of the chest area will also be of assistance. In the event your family dentist or doctor has destroyed any record of treatment for your son, then perhaps you could assist through personal knowledge and photographs. A complete description of your son's teeth would help. For instance, if you recall whether his teeth were short, long or average in size, crowded, or noticeably worn down in front. A close-up facial view photograph of your son, reflecting a smiling or laughing expression, would be of great assistance. After the photograph has been examined and a copy made for his records, it will be promptly returned.

While available information leads us to believe that the remains may be those of your son, it is not my desire to raise your hopes that a positive association has been established at this time. Before a final determination can be made, it is necessary to verify all identifying factors. You may be assured that the Army pursues every effort to conclusively identify the remains of our honored war dead.

Tour cooperation in this matter will be appreciated. For your convenience in replying, I am enclosing an envelope which requires no postage. Your son's name, rank and service number should be included in any communication pertaining to him.

SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are reporte by official records as Missing In Action or Killed In Action during groun air or naval operations in the department of Manche, France, from the period of 5 June 1944 to 15 August 1944. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigations have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specifi information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Offic and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of the Manche, have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Manche department, fc the most part, consists of farm and pasture land which has been under constant cultivation and daily use since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore only be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification. The absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide evidence, and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these

conclusions.
