OFFICIAL BUSINESS

To the War Department:

We received your letter notifying us that some personal property belonging to Pvt. Vittolh Seder was supposed to arrive within 30 days. Monday, upon my arrival home from work, my mother informed me that the expected parcel had arrived.

I am the sister of Vittolh Seder and on behalf of my parents and myself I wish to express my bitterest feelings towards all of you and your kind.

How can you dare of sending the families of the deceased such articles as we found? It was nothing but plain junk! The wallet was a gift from me and was in a shameful condition. We can understand this to the extent of the inhuman life a soldier leads, but where is just one piece of currency? My brother was never BROKE and by the condition of his wallet we are lead to believe he didn't have a dime. Who picked his pockets while he was lying dead? That we would like to know!

Among the articles that we received were rosaries, a bloody prayer book, a fountain pen, that is not in working condition (that must be the reason it was sent because it was of little value of anyone else), a lead pencil and a few snapshots.

He had a shock-proof, water-proof, self-winding wrist watch that my parents and I bought for him when he was drafted. Where is that watch? Who has it now? His girl-friend bought him a beautiful double headed tiger cameo ring for Christmas and that is not among those articles sent. The property that my brother had that was of some value was obviously stolen from and that which was of little value returned to us. In plain words that is the lowest dirtiest trick that could be pulled on anyone.

Our boys go to serve our country hating, fearing and dreading the thought of warfare. Their families, sweethearts and friends suffer all that the boy in service suffers. It is alright for those who can secure a nice soft position here at home and enjoy all the privileges of the service man but for those having to participate in actual combat it is sheer HELL!

Why are our boys fighting and dying in countries that do not belong to the United States or places that until now were unheard of. Is it because a few of our so-called big-wigs can't settle an argument between themselves or is it just a put up job and the war will be over when enough of our boys have paid the supreme sacrifice?

Several people have suggested that we write you about this and fast!
